## HOUSE BILL NO. 1187

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-307, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DETERMINATION OF THE ANNUAL CONVERSION OF UNUSED VACATION OR PERSONAL LEAVE TO SICK LEAVE FOR LICENSED OR
- 3 VACATION OR PERSONAL LEAVE TO SICK LEAVE FOR LICENSED OR 4 UNLICENSED SCHOOL EMPLOYEES AND TO RECOGNIZE LEAVE ACCUMULATED
- 5 UNDER PREVIOUS POLICY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-7-307, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 37-7-307. (1) For purposes of this section, the term
- 10 "licensed employee" means any employee of a public school district
- 11 required to hold a valid license by the Commission on Teacher and
- 12 Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and
- 13 Development.
- 14 (2) The school board of a school district shall establish by
- 15 rules and regulations a policy of sick leave with pay for licensed
- 16 employees and teacher assistants employed in the school district,
- 17 and such policy shall include the following minimum provisions for
- 18 sick and emergency leave with pay:
- 19 (a) Each licensed employee and teacher assistant, at
- 20 the beginning of each school year, shall be credited with a
- 21 minimum sick leave allowance, with pay, of seven (7) days for
- 22 absences caused by illness or physical disability of the employee
- 23 during that school year.
- 24 (b) Any unused portion of the total sick leave
- 25 allowance shall be carried over to the next school year and
- 26 credited to such licensed employee and teacher assistant if the
- 27 licensed employee or teacher assistant remains employed in the
- 28 same school district. In the event any public school licensed

- 29 employee or teacher assistant transfers from one public school
- 30 district in Mississippi to another, any unused portion of the
- 31 total sick leave allowance credited to such licensed employee or
- 32 teacher assistant shall be credited to such licensed employee or
- 33 teacher assistant in the computation of unused leave for
- 34 retirement purposes under Section 25-11-109. Accumulation of sick
- 35 leave allowed under this section shall be unlimited.
- 36 (c) No deduction from the pay of such licensed employee
- 37 or teacher assistant may be made because of absence of such
- 38 licensed employee or teacher assistant caused by illness or
- 39 physical disability of the licensed employee or teacher assistant
- 40 until after all sick leave allowance credited to such licensed
- 41 employee or teacher assistant has been used.
- 42 (d) For the first ten (10) days of absence of a
- 43 licensed employee because of illness or physical disability, in
- 44 any school year, in excess of the sick leave allowance credited to
- 45 such licensed employee, there may be deducted from the pay of such
- 46 licensed employee the established substitute amount of licensed
- 47 employee compensation paid in that local school district,
- 48 necessitated because of the absence of the licensed employee as a
- 49 result of illness or physical disability. Thereafter, the regular
- 50 pay of such absent licensed employee may be suspended and withheld
- 51 in its entirety for any period of absence because of illness or
- 52 physical disability during that school year.
- 53 (3) Beginning with the school year 1983-1984, each licensed
- 54 employee at the beginning of each school year shall be credited
- 55 with a minimum personal leave allowance, with pay, of two (2) days
- 56 for absences caused by personal reasons during that school year.
- 57 Such personal leave shall not be taken on the first day of the
- 58 school term, the last day of the school term, on a day previous to
- 59 a holiday or a day after a holiday. Personal leave may be used
- 60 for professional purposes, including absences caused by attendance
- of such licensed employee at a seminar, class, training program,

- 62 professional association or other functions designed for
- 63 educators. No deduction from the pay of such licensed employee
- 64 may be made because of absence of such licensed employee caused by
- 65 personal reasons until after all personal leave allowance credited
- 66 to such licensed employee has been used. However, the
- 67 superintendent of a school district, in his discretion, may allow
- 68 a licensed employee personal leave in addition to any minimum
- 69 personal leave allowance, under the condition that there shall be
- 70 deducted from the salary of such licensed employee the actual
- 71 amount of any compensation paid to any person as a substitute,
- 72 necessitated because of the absence of the licensed employee. Any
- 73 unused portion of the total personal leave allowance up to five
- 74 (5) days shall be carried over to the next school year and
- 75 credited to such licensed employee if the licensed employee
- 76 remains employed in the same school district.
- 77 (4) Beginning with the school year 1992-1993, each licensed
- 78 employee shall be credited with a professional leave allowance,
- 79 with pay, for each day of absence caused by reason of such
- 80 employee's statutorily required membership and attendance at a
- 81 regular or special meeting held within the State of Mississippi of
- 82 the State Board of Education, the Commission on Teacher and
- 83 Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and
- 84 Development, the Commission on School Accreditation, the
- 85 Mississippi Authority for Educational Television, the meetings of
- 86 the state textbook rating committees or other meetings authorized
- 87 by local school board policy.
- 88 (5) Upon retirement from employment, each licensed and
- 89 nonlicensed employee shall be paid for not more than thirty (30)
- 90 days of unused accumulated leave earned while employed by the
- 91 school district in which the employee is last employed. Such
- 92 payment for licensed employees shall be made by the school
- 93 district at a rate equal to the amount paid to substitute teachers
- 94 and for nonlicensed employees, the payment shall be made by the

- 95 school district at a rate equal to the federal minimum wage. The
- 96 payment shall be treated in the same manner for retirement
- 97 purposes as a lump-sum payment for personal leave as provided in
- 98 Section 25-11-103(e). Any remaining lawfully credited unused
- 99 leave, for which payment has not been made, shall be certified to
- 100 the Public Employees' Retirement System in the same manner and
- 101 subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by law for
- 102 unused leave. No payment for unused accumulated leave may be made
- 103 to either a licensed or nonlicensed employee at termination or
- 104 separation from service for any purpose other than for the purpose
- 105 of retirement.
- 106 (6) The school board may adopt rules and regulations which
- 107 will reasonably aid to implement the policy of sick and personal
- 108 leave, including, but not limited to, rules and regulations having
- 109 the following general effect:
- 110 (a) Requiring the absent employee to furnish the
- 111 certificate of a physician or dentist or other medical
- 112 practitioner as to the illness of the absent licensed employee,
- 113 where the absence is for four (4) or more consecutive school days,
- 114 or for two (2) consecutive school days immediately preceding or
- 115 following a nonschool day;
- (b) Providing penalties, by way of full deduction from
- 117 salary, or entry on the work record of the employee, or other
- 118 appropriate penalties, for any materially false statement by the
- 119 employee as to the cause of absence;
- 120 (c) Forfeiture of accumulated or future sick leave, if
- 121 the absence of the employee is caused by optional dental or
- 122 medical treatment or surgery which could, without medical risk,
- 123 have been provided, furnished or performed at a time when school
- 124 was not in session;
- 125 (d) Enlarging, increasing or providing greater sick or
- 126 personal leave allowances than the minimum standards established

- by this section in the discretion of the school board of each school district.
- 129 (7) School boards may include in their budgets provisions
- 130 for the payment of substitute employees, necessitated because of
- 131 the absence of regular licensed employees. All such substitute
- 132 employees shall be paid wholly from district funds, except as
- 133 otherwise provided for long-term substitute teachers in Section
- 134 37-19-20. Such school boards, in their discretion, also may pay,
- 135 from district funds other than adequate education program funds,
- 136 the whole or any part of the salaries of all employees granted
- 137 leaves for the purpose of special studies or training.
- 138 (8) The school board may further adopt rules and regulations
- 139 which will reasonably implement such leave policies for all other
- 140 nonlicensed and hourly paid school employees as the board deems
- 141 appropriate.
- 142 (9) Vacation leave granted to either licensed or nonlicensed
- 143 employees shall be synonymous with personal leave. Unused
- 144 vacation or personal leave accumulated by licensed employees in
- 145 excess of the maximum five (5) days which may be carried over from
- 146 one (1) year to the next may be converted to sick leave. The
- 147 annual conversion of unused vacation or personal leave to sick
- 148 days for licensed or unlicensed employees shall not exceed the
- 149 allowable number of personal leave days as provided in Section
- 150 25-3-93. The annual total number of converted unused vacation
- 151 and/or personal days added to the annual unused sick days for any
- 152 employee shall not exceed the combined allowable number of days
- 153 per year provided in Sections 25-3-93 and 25-3-95. Local school
- 154 board policies that provide for vacation, personal and sick leave
- 155 for employees shall not exceed the provisions for leave as
- 156 provided in Sections 25-3-93 and 25-3-95. Any personal or
- 157 vacation leave previously converted to sick leave under a lawfully
- 158 adopted policy before May 1, 2004, or such personal or vacation
- 159 leave accumulated and available for use prior to May 1, 2004,

- 160 under a lawfully adopted policy but converted to sick leave after 161 May 1, 2004, shall be recognized as accrued leave by the local
- 162 school district and available for use by the employee. The leave
- 163 converted under a lawfully adopted policy prior to May 1, 2004, or
- such personal and vacation leave accumulated and available for use 165 as of May 1, 2004, which was subsequently converted to sick leave
- may be certified to the Public Employees' Retirement System upon 166
- termination of employment and any such leave previously converted 167
- 168 and certified to the Public Employees' Retirement System shall be
- 169 recognized.

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- 170 (10) (a) For the purposes of this subsection, the following
- words and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed in this 171
- 172 paragraph unless the context requires otherwise:
- (i) "Catastrophic injury or illness" means a 173
- 174 life-threatening injury or illness of an employee or a member of
- an employee's immediate family that totally incapacitates the 175
- employee from work, as verified by a licensed physician, and 176
- 177 forces the employee to exhaust all leave time earned by that
- employee, resulting in the loss of compensation from the local 178
- 179 school district for the employee. Conditions that are short-term
- 180 in nature, including, but not limited to, common illnesses such as
- 181 influenza and the measles, and common injuries, are not
- 182 catastrophic. Chronic illnesses or injuries, such as cancer or
- major surgery, that result in intermittent absences from work and 183
- 184 that are long-term in nature and require long recuperation periods
- may be considered catastrophic. 185
- 186 "Immediate family" means spouse, parent,
- stepparent, sibling, child or stepchild. 187
- (b) Any school district employee may donate a portion 188
- 189 of his or her unused accumulated personal leave or sick leave to
- 190 another employee of the same or another school district who is
- 191 suffering from a catastrophic injury or illness or who has a

- 192 member of his or her immediate family suffering from a
- 193 catastrophic injury or illness, in accordance with the following:
- 194 (i) The employee donating the leave (the "donor
- 195 employee") shall designate the employee who is to receive the
- 196 leave (the "recipient employee") and the amount of unused
- 197 accumulated personal leave and sick leave that is to be donated,
- 198 and shall notify the school district superintendent or his
- 199 designee of his or her designation.
- 200 (ii) The maximum amount of unused accumulated
- 201 personal leave that an employee may donate to any other employee
- 202 may not exceed a number of days that would leave the donor
- 203 employee with fewer than seven (7) days of personal leave
- 204 remaining, and the maximum amount of unused accumulated sick leave
- 205 that an employee may donate to any other employee may not exceed
- 206 fifty percent (50%) of the unused accumulated sick leave of the
- 207 donor employee.
- 208 (iii) An employee must have exhausted all of his
- 209 or her available leave before he or she will be eligible to
- 210 receive any leave donated by another employee. Eligibility for
- 211 donated leave shall be based upon review and approval by the donor
- 212 employee's supervisor.
- 213 (iv) Before an employee may receive donated leave,
- 214 he or she must provide the school district superintendent or his
- 215 designee with a physician's statement that states the beginning
- 216 date of the catastrophic injury or illness, a description of the
- 217 injury or illness, and a prognosis for recovery and the
- 218 anticipated date that the recipient employee will be able to
- 219 return to work.
- 220 (v) If the total amount of leave that is donated
- 221 to any employee is not used by the recipient employee, the whole
- 222 days of donated leave shall be returned to the donor employees on
- 223 a pro rata basis, based on the ratio of the number of days of

- 224 leave donated by each donor employee to the total number of days
- of leave donated by all donor employees. 225
- 226 (vi) Donated leave shall not be used in lieu of
- disability retirement. 227
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 228
- 229 and after its passage.
