HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 23

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING PAUL COLLINS UPON BEING NAMED
2 "OUTSTANDING CITIZEN" BY THE BILOXI LIONS CLUB.

3 WHEREAS, Paul Collins, a World War II veteran and father of
4 nine who developed subdivisions in Biloxi and Gulfport, was named
5 Biloxi's "Outstanding Citizen" for 2004 by the Biloxi Lions Club;

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Collins is the seventy-fourth recipient of this
8 honor, which celebrates deeds done in the previous year and those
9 performed over the nominee's lifetime; and

10 WHEREAS, at age 81, Mr. Collins continues in the grand
11 tradition of the great leaders and citizens of the coastal
12 community through the giving and sharing of his many gifts and
13 talents; and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Collins humbly credited his parents with
15 instilling in him the virtues of community service, is a member
16 emeritus of the Bancorp South Advisory Board, past president of
17 the Home Builders Association of the Mississippi Coast, a 58-year
18 member of the American Legion, 16-year member of the Edgewater
19 Rotary Club and former vice president of the Chamber of Commerce;

21 WHEREAS, having also worked with Back Bay Mission and Habitat
22 for Humanity, Mr. Collins' dedication to the community has been
23 praised by Biloxi's Mayor, A.J. Holloway, for his positive impact;

25 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives of
26 the State of Mississippi to recognize and commend excellence in
27 such outstanding citizens as Mr. Collins, whose contributions to

28 the Biloxi community will have a tremendous impact upon the city's
29 citizens:
