- 28 Employees and Laborers Pension Fund and Board of Directors for the
- 29 Chicago Horticultural Society; and
- 30 WHEREAS, as the 1996-1997 Chairperson of the City's College
- 31 Fund/United Negro College Fund campaign, Ms. Lumpkin boosted
- 32 donations by fifty percent, raising nearly half a million dollars;

- 34 WHEREAS, Mayor Richard M. Daley appointed Ms. Lumpkin as
- 35 Chicago's budget director in 1998 and city treasurer in 1999, thus
- 36 allowing her to become the only woman in Chicago to hold all three
- 37 positions of city comptroller, budget director and city treasurer;

- 39 WHEREAS, in the July 2000 issue of Today's Chicago Woman, Ms.
- 40 Lumpkin was cited as one of the one hundred most influential women
- 41 in Chicago making a difference through community involvement and
- 42 professional achievements; and

- 44 president and director of public affairs with Northern Trust
- 45 Company, where she continues leading an exemplary career, Ms.
- 46 Lumpkin maintains professional affiliations with the Illinois
- 47 Sports Facilities Authority, Chicago Horticultural Society,
- 48 Chicago Children's Advocacy Center, Chicago One Stop Capitol Shop,
- 49 Chicago Finance Exchange, Urban Bankers Forum of Chicago, Chicago
- 50 Service Club and the United Negro College Fund; and
- 51 WHEREAS, the widow of the late Robert "Bob" Lumpkin, Ms.
- 52 Lumpkin is the proud mother of one child, daughter, LaTonya
- 53 Lumpkin, who has supported her in all her endeavors; and
- 54 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 55 recognize and commend the excellence of Mississippi's native sons
- 56 and daughters who have brought great esteem to themselves and to
- 57 Mississippi as has Ms. Lumpkin, whose career success is a
