SENATE BILL NO. 2735

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF TANNING DEVICES AT TANNING FACILITIES BY CHILDREN UNDER AGE 14; TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF 3 TANNING DEVICES AT TANNING FACILITIES BY CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES 4 OF 14 AND 18 UNLESS THE CHILD'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN HAS GIVEN WRITTEN CONSENT TO THE TANNING FACILITY; TO REQUIRE THE PARENT OR 6 GUARDIAN TO SIGN THE CONSENT FORM IN THE PRESENCE OF THE OPERATOR 7 OF THE TANNING FACILITY; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CONSENT IS VALID FOR 8 30 DAYS FROM THE DATE OF SIGNATURE; TO REQUIRE THE PARENT OR 9 GUARDIAN TO SPECIFY THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF TIMES THAT THE CHILD MAY USE A TANNING DEVICE AT THE TANNING FACILITY DURING THE THIRTY-DAY 10 11 PERIOD; TO REQUIRE ADDITIONAL WRITTEN CONSENT FOR THE CHILD TO USE A TANNING DEVICE AT A TANNING FACILITY AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF THE 12 THIRTY-DAY PERIOD; TO REQUIRE TANNING FACILITIES TO MAINTAIN THE 13 CONSENT FORMS AND CERTAIN RECORDS REGARDING THE USE OF TANNING 14 DEVICES AT THE TANNING FACILITIES BY THOSE CHILDREN; TO PROVIDE 15 16 CRIMINAL AND CIVIL PENALTIES FOR TANNING FACILITIES THAT VIOLATE 17 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 19 **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section:
- 20 (a) "Tanning device" means any equipment that emits radiation used for tanning of the skin, such as a sunlamp, tanning 21
- booth or tanning bed, and includes any accompanying equipment, 22
- 23 such as protective eyewear, timers and handrails; and
- (b) "Tanning facility" means any place where a tanning 24
- 25 device is used for a fee, membership dues, or any other
- 26 compensation.
- 27 (2) A child under fourteen (14) years of age shall not use a
- 28 tanning device at a tanning facility.
- 29 (3) A child fourteen (14) years of age or older but under
- eighteen (18) years of age shall not use a tanning device at a 30
- tanning facility unless the child's parent or legal guardian has 31
- provided written consent to the tanning facility. The tanning 32
- 33 facility may accept proof of the child's age from a valid driver's
- 34 license or other government issued identification containing the

- 35 date of birth and a photograph of the child. The parent or
- 36 guardian shall sign the consent form in the presence of the
- 37 operator of the tanning facility, and that consent is valid for
- 38 thirty (30) days from the date of signature. The parent or
- 39 guardian shall state on the consent form his or her relationship
- 40 with the child and the age of the child, and shall specify the
- 41 maximum number of times that the child may use a tanning device at
- 42 the tanning facility during the thirty-day period. After the
- 43 expiration of the thirty-day period, the child shall not use a
- 44 tanning device at a tanning facility until the child's parent or
- 45 legal guardian has provided additional written consent in
- 46 accordance with the requirements of this subsection.
- 47 (3) Each tanning facility shall:
- 48 (a) Maintain the written consent forms of the parents
- 49 or guardians for a period of not less than two (2) years, and make
- 50 the forms available to law enforcement personnel for inspection
- 51 upon request; and
- (b) Make written records showing the dates and duration
- 53 of use of a tanning device at the tanning facility by children
- 54 fourteen (14) years of age or older but under eighteen (18) years
- of age, maintain those records for a period of not less than two
- 56 (2) years, and make the records available to law enforcement
- 57 personnel for inspection upon request.
- 58 (4) A tanning facility that allows a child to use a tanning
- 59 device at the tanning facility in violation of the provisions of
- 60 this section, or fails to make and maintain the records required
- 61 by this section, or knowingly makes false entries in those
- 62 records, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof,
- 63 shall be fined not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor
- 64 more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). In addition, a
- 65 tanning facility that allows a person to use a tanning device at
- 66 the tanning facility in violation of the provisions of this
- 67 section is liable for a civil penalty of One Thousand Dollars

- 68 (\$1,000.00) per incident, which may be recovered in any court of
- 69 competent jurisdiction by the parent or legal guardian of the
- 70 child that the tanning facility allowed to use the tanning device
- 71 in violation of this section.
- 72 (5) This section does not apply to a licensed health care
- 73 professional who uses a tanning device for the treatment of
- 74 patients, if that use is within the lawful scope of practice of
- 75 the health care professional.
- 76 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 77 and after July 1, 2005.
