1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT BEGINNING WITH THE 2005-2006 SCHOOL YEAR, TEACHERS SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL EXPERIENCE INCREMENT FOR UP TO 30 YEARS OF TEACHING SERVICE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
9	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
10	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi
11	Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county
12	and separate school district shall be determined and paid in
13	accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in
14	this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of

62 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 63 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 64 65 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 66 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 67 68 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to establish, administer and maintain the system. 69 70 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 71

72 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any 73 74 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 75 76 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 77 The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the 78 79 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement. 80

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For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$740.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$675.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have thirty (30) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have thirty (30) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have thirty (30) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have thirty (30) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license S. B. No. 2856 *SSO2/R1050*

- 128 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current 129 school year. The following employees shall receive an annual 130 (2) (a) 131 salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars 132 (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other 133 compensation to which the employee may be entitled: 134 Any licensed teacher who has met the (i) requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the 135 136 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education 137 138 as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 139 140 certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 141 year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State 142 143 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be 144 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 145 second term of the school year. 146
- (ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements 147 and acquired a certificate from the National Board for Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a 148 149 local school board or the State Board of Education as a school 150 nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse 151 shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education 152 that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 153 154 year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation 155 to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 156 157 second term of the school year. Provided, however, that the total 158 number of licensed school nurses eligible for a salary supplement 159 under this paragraph (ii) shall not exceed twenty (20).

L86	audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of
L87	Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior
L88	to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary
L89	supplement in the current school year, or the licensed
L90	speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such
L91	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to

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- An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the employee.
- 212 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process (C) 213 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 214 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program 215 216 allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to 217 218 appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving 219 such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 220 221 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience 222 otherwise are entitled.

230	shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for

232	behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or
233	endorsement.
