SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 36

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF ROGERS HOWARD "R.H."  
2 BEARDEN, OUTSTANDING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR AND WORLD WAR II AND  
3 KOREAN WAR VETERAN FROM TALLAHATCHIE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AND  
4 EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

5 WHEREAS, Rogers Howard "R.H." Bearden, outstanding  
6 professional educator and administrator and World War II and  
7 Korean War Veteran from Sumner, Tallahatchie County, Mississippi,  
8 departed this life on March 3, 2005; and

9 WHEREAS, Rogers Howard "R.H." Bearden was born March 26,  
10 1918, in the Pilgrim-Blue Slough area of Sawyer Plantation near  
11 Web, Mississippi. He was the oldest of eleven living children  
12 born to the union of Oscar and Everlean (Moore) Bearden; and

13 WHEREAS, he joined New Pilgrim Baptist Church at ten years of  
14 age, and became increasingly active in the church as he grew  
15 older. He later joined the Old Antioch Baptist Church where he  
16 served as Superintendent and Adult Sunday School Teacher, Church  
17 Clerk, and Chairman of the Deacon Board; and

18 WHEREAS, at 16 and in the sixth grade, his parents enrolled  
19 him in Johnson High School, a private school operated by the AME  
20 Zion Church near Brazil, Mississippi. In the Fall of 1937, his  
21 family moved to Charleston, Mississippi, where he attended  
22 Tallahatchie County Training School. Here he served in a number  
23 of offices including Class President and graduated as Salutatorian  
24 in May 1941, at the age of 23; and

25 WHEREAS, upon completion of high school, he was drafted into  
26 the Army and reported to Camp Shelby, Mississippi on July 16,  
27 1941. He underwent basic training at Camp Wheeler near Macon,  
28 Georgia. In March 1942, he was transferred to Camp Benning,

29 Georgia, where he joined the Officer Candidate Class and graduated  
30 a Second Lieutenant of Infantry on March 29, 1942, later joining  
31 Company "K" 369th, 93rd Infantry Division, Fort Huachuca, Arizona  
32 in June 1942. His unit later sailed to Guadalcanal in the Solomon  
33 Islands, South Pacific Theater under the command of General  
34 Douglas McArthur. He also served on the Islands of Emariau, New  
35 Georgia, Morotai and Mindanao in the Philippines. He commanded  
36 Company "I" 369th Infantry in Mindanao as Captain where he engaged  
37 in "mopping up" operations in Morotai and his unit was responsible  
38 for the capture of an Ouchi General. He returned to active duty  
39 in 1951 to serve during the Korean War. He was assigned to  
40 Company "A" of the 102nd Infantry Regiment in Augsburg, Germany.  
41 He was later transferred to the Intelligence "Order of Battle" G-2  
42 section of the 43rd Infantry Division in 1952. In June 1954, he  
43 was promoted to the rank of Major in the Army Reserve; and

44 WHEREAS, he returned to the states in May 1946 entering  
45 Tuskegee Institute (now Tuskegee University) in June 1946 under  
46 the G.I. Bill and matriculated as an Agricultural student in  
47 Agronomy. He graduated from Tuskegee Institute in 1949 with a  
48 Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture. He continued graduate  
49 study at Tuskegee and received a Masters of Science Degree in  
50 Agriculture in 1950, and a Masters of Education Degree in 1958.  
51 While at Tuskegee, he met and married Lela W. James of Lisman,  
52 Alabama, on November 13, 1948; and

53 WHEREAS, in the Fall of 1954, he became Principal of the  
54 Solomon Chapel Elementary School in Phillip, Mississippi. After  
55 two years, he was made Principal of Tutwiler High School, and when  
56 West District High School opened with an enrollment of 1300 in  
57 grades one through twelve on October 16, 1957, Bearden was its  
58 first Principal. One of the most notable events in his tenure as  
59 Principal was April 23, 1973, when parts of the building were  
60 devastated by a strong tornado. He served at West District

61 through its many transitions until his retirement on July 1, 1982;  
62 and

63 WHEREAS, his professional honors and affiliations include:  
64 Personalities of the South, Twelfth Edition; Tallahatchie County  
65 Retired Teachers Association; State Health Planning Advisory  
66 Council; Girl Scouts of America supporter; West Tallahatchie  
67 Association of Educators; Mississippi State Teachers Association;  
68 R.H. Bearden Junior High School, named in July 23, 1995; Gamma Phi  
69 Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity; Habitat for Humanity  
70 Advisory Board; and Tallahatchie County Board of Education; and

71 WHEREAS, living to celebrate his life are: his wife of 56  
72 years, Lela James Bearden; three daughters, Cynthia Bearden  
73 McAdory (John Thomas) of Miami, Florida, Marilyn Bearden Robinson  
74 (Lloyd) of Memphis, Tennessee and Faye Bearden Walker (Charles) of  
75 New Orleans, Louisiana; grandchildren, Jocelyne Patrice McAdory,  
76 Columbia, Missouri, John Bearden McAdory, Atlanta, Georgia, Donna  
77 Lynette Neely, New Orleans, Louisiana, Jillian Alexandria McAdory,  
78 Atlanta, Georgia, and Meredith Alicia Robinson, Memphis,  
79 Tennessee; his surviving siblings, Tanzil Bearden, Charleston,  
80 Mississippi, Evelyn Tensley, Detroit, Michigan, Navois Bearden,  
81 Topeka, Kansas, and Bennie J. Gooden, Detroit, Michigan; and a  
82 host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives, students,  
83 church members and friends; and

84 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this  
85 respected Mississippian:

86 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF  
87 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That  
88 we do hereby commend the life of Rogers Howard "R.H." Bearden,  
89 outstanding professional educator, administrator and World War II  
90 and Korean War Veteran and extend to his surviving family the  
91 sympathy of the Legislature on his passing.
