6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
LO	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
L1	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
L2	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
L3	July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006 \$ 773,189.00.
L4	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special

47	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
48	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
49	Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006
50	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
51	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the
52	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
53	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
54	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all

56	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure

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         Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
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    the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
    allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
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    Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
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    approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.
    Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
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    approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
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    without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
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    appropriated level.
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         No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
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    used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
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    being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
    act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
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         The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
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    award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,
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    realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other
    means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless
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    specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of
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    teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the
    next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
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    educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public
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    Accountant License or higher level professional certification as
    determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement
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    of a departing employee with an individual from within state
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    service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the
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    departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
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pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

- 97 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 98 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon
- 99 the request of a local public emergency management organization in

- 102 the local emergency management organization determines that such
- 103 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the

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          SECTION 10. None of the funds appropriated in Section 6
     shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State
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     Treasury for disaster relief except as provided for in Sections
     43-41-1 et seq. and 43-41-301 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.
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          SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
     agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to
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     the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
     detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
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     during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process.
          SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
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     Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency
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     may authorize increases in any major objects of expenditures in
     total amounts not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the
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     appropriated amount of each major object of expenditure, provided
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     that other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a
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     corresponding dollar amount. However, no transfers shall be
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     authorized which increase the major object of expenditure
     "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits."
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          SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
     Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency
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     shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred
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     Thousand Dollars ($500,000.00) from any general or special fund
     treasury fund and major object budget category to another special
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     or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category
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     accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency
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     Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more
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     efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the
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- intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the
 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written
 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
 fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the
 transfer.

 SECTION 14. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
- section 14. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
 this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be
 paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
 Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
 officers in the manner provided by law.
