- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, unless the context 8 9 clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Certified peer support member" means an emergency 11 responder or civilian volunteer of an emergency service agency or entity who has received training in critical incident stress 12
- 13 management and who is certified as a peer support member by the State Board of Health or the Department of Public Safety to
- provide emotional and moral support to an emergency responder who 15
- needs those services as a result of job-related stress or an 16
- 17 incident in which the emergency responder was involved while
- acting in his official capacity. 18
- "Peer support event" means any debriefing, defusing 19
- 20 or counseling session conducted by a certified peer support member
- that involves the emotional or moral support of an emergency 21
- 22 responder who needs those services as a result of job-related
- stress or an incident in which the emergency responder was 23
- involved while acting in his official capacity. 24
- 25 (2) A certified peer support member shall not be compelled,
- without the consent of the emergency responder making the 26
- 27 communication, to testify or in any way disclose the contents of
- any communication made to the certified peer support member by the 28
- 29 emergency responder while engaged in a peer support event. This

- 30 privilege only applies when the communication was made to the
- 31 certified peer support member during the course of an actual peer
- 32 support event.
- 33 (3) The privilege shall not apply if:
- 34 (a) The certified peer support member was an initial
- 35 emergency service responder, a witness or a party to the incident
- 36 that prompted the providing of the peer support event to the
- 37 emergency responder; or
- 38 (b) A communication reveals the intended commission of
- 39 a crime or harmful act and such disclosure is determined to be
- 40 necessary by the certified peer support member to protect any
- 41 person from a clear, imminent risk of serious mental or physical
- 42 harm or injury, or to forestall a serious threat to the public
- 43 safety.
- 44 (4) Any certified peer support member who reveals the
- 45 contents of a privileged communication, or any person who
- 46 threatens, intimidates, or in any way attempts to compel a
- 47 certified peer support member to disclose the contents of a
- 48 privileged communication, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 49 shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars
- 50 (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than
- 51 six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- 52 (5) Any person who is an employee of this state, or any
- 53 political subdivision thereof, who is convicted of a crime under
- 54 this section shall be removed from office.
- 55 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 56 and after July 1, 2006.
