SENATE BILL NO. 2724 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-19-403, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PLACE THE MISSISSIPPI INSTITUTE FOR FOREST INVENTORY WITHIN THE 3 STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE INSTITUTE FOR FOREST INVENTORY; TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADVISORY BOARD TO THE INSTITUTE; TO AMEND SECTION 49-19-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, <u>TO REVISE THE QUALIFICATIONS OF THE STATE FORESTER AND</u> TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION 6 7 SHALL HAVE POWER AND DUTY TO IMPLEMENT THE FOREST INVENTORY ACT; 8 TO AMEND 49-19-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ADD THE CHAIRMAN OF 9 THE ADVISORY BOARD TO THE INSTITUTE FOR FOREST INVENTORY SHALL BE 10 11 AN EX OFFICIO MEMBER OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 49-19-403, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 amended as follows: 15 16 49-19-403. (1) * * * There is hereby created the Mississippi Institute for Forest Inventory. The institute shall 17 be under the jurisdiction of the State Forestry Commission. The 18 budget of the institute shall be funded through a separate line 19 20 item within the general appropriation bill for the support and maintenance of the State Forestry Commission. 21 (2) The institute shall be headed by a director who shall be 22 appointed by the State Forester. The advisory board shall submit 23 three (3) qualified nominees to the State Forester for the 24 position of director. The State Forester shall appoint the 25 director from the list of nominees submitted. The director shall 26 serve at the will and pleasure of the State Forester. 27

(3) (a) There is hereby created an advisory board to the

Mississippi Institute for Forest Inventory. The advisory board

Mississippi Automated Resource Information System; the Executive

shall consist of eleven (11) members. The Director of the

Director of the Mississippi Development Authority, or his

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- 33 designee; the Director of the Forest and Wildlife Research Center
- 34 at Mississippi State University, or his designee; and the State
- 35 Forester, or his designee; shall be ex officio members with full
- 36 voting power.
- 37 (b) The Governor shall appoint four (4) members from
- 38 the state at large with the advice and consent of the Senate. The
- 39 Governor shall appoint one (1) member from each of the following
- 40 categories: a private nonindustrial forest landowner, a
- 41 Mississippi registered forester, a certified wildlife or fisheries
- 42 biologist, and a representative of an environmental organization.
- 43 Appointments made after January 1, 2005, shall be for initial
- 44 terms as follows: a private nonindustrial forest landowner, four
- 45 (4) years; a Mississippi registered forester, three (3) years; a
- 46 certified wildlife or fisheries biologist, two (2) years; and a
- 47 representative of an environmental organization one (1) year.
- 48 After the expiration of the initial terms, the terms shall be for
- 49 four (4) years.
- 50 (c) The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint three (3)
- 51 members from the state at large with the advice and consent of the
- 52 Senate. The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint one (1) member from
- 53 each of the following categories: the timber harvesting industry,
- 54 the forest products industry, and a citizen with forestry related
- 55 interests. Appointments made after January 1, 2005, shall be for
- 56 initial terms as follows: timber harvesting industry, four (4)
- 57 years; forest products industry, three (3) years; and a citizen
- 58 with forestry related interests, two (2) years. After the
- 59 expiration of the initial terms, the terms shall be for four (4)
- 60 years.
- 61 (d) The advisory board shall elect a chairman from its
- 62 <u>membership</u>.
- (e) The advisory board shall advise, assist and
- 64 recommend policies that aid the institute in the development and
- 65 implementation of a statewide forest inventory.

- (f) Members of the advisory board may be reimbursed for
- 67 mileage and actual and necessary expenses as provided under
- 68 Section 25-3-41.
- 69 (g) The Chairman of the Senate Forestry Committee and
- 70 the Chairman of the House Forestry Committee shall serve as
- 71 members of the Joint Institute for Forest Inventory Oversight
- 72 Committee. For attending meetings, the legislators shall receive
- 73 per diem and expenses from their respective contingent expense
- 74 funds at the rate authorized for committee meetings when the
- 75 Legislature is not in session. No per diem and expenses will be
- 76 paid for attending meetings when the Legislature is in session.
- 77 * * *
- 78 (4) The State Forestry Commission shall have the following
- 79 powers:
- 80 (a) To apply for, accept and expend any funds, grants
- 81 or gifts from any public or private sources in furtherance of the
- 82 institute's duties;
- 83 (b) To expend funds by appropriation or directly from
- 84 any federal, local or private sources;
- 85 (c) Enter into contracts and execute all instruments to
- 86 carry out the duties of the institute; and
- 87 * * *
- 88 (d) To do all acts necessary to carry out the duties of
- 89 the institute.
- 90 (5) All funds received by the institute shall be deposited
- 91 in the State Treasury for the use of the institute.
- 92 **SECTION 2.** Section 49-19-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 93 amended as follows:
- 94 49-19-3. The duties and powers of the commission shall be:
- 95 (a) To appoint a State Forester, who shall serve at the
- 96 will and pleasure of the commission and who is qualified to
- 97 perform the duties as set forth herein; and to pay him such salary
- 98 as is provided by the Legislature, and allow him such office

expenses incidental to the performance of his official duties as 99 100 the commission, in its discretion, may deem necessary; and to 101 charge him with the immediate direction and control, subject to 102 the supervision and approval of the commission, of all matters 103 relating to forestry as authorized herein. Any person appointed 104 by the commission as State Forester shall have received (i) a bachelor's degree in forestry from an accredited school or college 105 of forestry and shall be licensed and registered under the 106 107 provisions of the Mississippi Foresters Registration Law (Section 73-36-1 et seq.) and in addition shall have had at least five (5) 108 109 years' administrative experience in a forestry-related field, or (ii) a bachelor's degree in public or business administration and 110 111 at least eight (8) years' experience in a public or private 112 organization with administrative management functions directly related to those of the agency, with five (5) of those years in an 113 114 administrative management position with personnel supervision and 115 budget management responsibilities.

- 116 To take such action and provide and maintain such organized means as may seem necessary and expedient to prevent, 117 118 control and extinguish forest fires, including the enforcement of 119 any and all laws pertaining to the protection of forests and 120 woodland.
- 121 (C) To encourage forest and tree planting for the production of a wood crop, for the protection of water supply, for 122 123 windbreak and shade, or for any other beneficial purposes 124 contributing to the general welfare, public hygiene and comfort of 125 the people.
- To cause to be made such technical investigations 126 and studies concerning forest conditions, the propagation, care 127 128 and protection of forest and shade trees, the care and management 129 of forests, their growth, yield and the products and by-products 130 thereof, and any other competent subject, including forest

- 131 taxation, bearing on the timber supply and needs of the state,
- 132 which the commission, in its discretion, may deem proper.
- 133 (e) To assist and cooperate with any federal or state
- 134 department or institution, county, town, corporation or
- 135 individual, under such terms as in the judgment of the commission
- 136 will best serve the public interest, in the preparation and
- 137 execution of plans for the protection, management, replacement, or
- 138 extension of the forest, woodland and roadside or other ornamental
- 139 tree growth in the state.
- 140 (f) To encourage public interest in forestry by means
- 141 of correspondence, the public press, periodicals, the publication
- 142 of bulletins and leaflets for general distribution, the delivery
- 143 of lectures in the schools and other suitable means, and to
- 144 cooperate to the fullest extent with the extension department
- 145 services of the state colleges in promoting reforestation. It
- 146 shall be the duty of the State Forester to cooperate with private
- 147 timber owners in laying plans for the protection, management and
- 148 replacement of forests and in aiding them to form protection
- 149 associations. It shall be his duty to examine all timbered lands
- 150 belonging to the state and its institutions and report to the
- 151 commission upon their timber conditions and actual value, and also
- 152 whether some of these lands may not be held as state forests. He
- 153 shall be responsible for the protection and management of lands
- 154 donated, purchased or belonging to the state or state
- 155 institutions, and all other lands reserved by the state as state
- 156 forests.
- 157 (g) To control the expenditure of any and all funds
- 158 appropriated or otherwise made available for the several purposes
- 159 set forth herein under suitable regulations and restrictions by
- 160 the commission and to specifically authorize any officer or
- 161 employee of the commission to incur necessary and stipulated
- 162 expenses in connection with the work in which such person may be
- 163 engaged.

- (h) To submit annually to the Legislature a report of
 the expenditures, proceedings and results achieved, together with
 such other matters including recommendations concerning
 legislation as are germane to the aims and purposes of this
 chapter.
- (i) To create, establish and organize the State of
 Mississippi into forestry districts for the most effective and
 efficient administration of the commission.
- To appoint, upon the State Forester's 172 (j) recommendation, six (6) individuals who shall be designated 173 174 Mississippi Forestry Commission Law Enforcement Officers with authority to bear arms, investigate and make arrests; however, the 175 176 law enforcement duties and authority of the officers shall be limited to woods arson. The officers shall comply with applicable 177 minimum educational and training standards for law enforcement 178 179 officers. These officers may issue citations for any violation of 180 those laws for recklessly or with gross negligence causing fire to 181 burn the lands of another. A citation issued by a Forestry Commission law enforcement officer shall be issued on a uniform 182 183 citation form consisting of an original and at least two (2) 184 copies. Such citation shall show, among other necessary 185 information, the name of the issuing officer, the name of the 186 court in which the cause is to be heard and the date and time the 187 person charged with a violation is to appear to answer the charge. 188 The uniform citation form shall make a provision on it for information that will constitute a complaint charging the offense 189 190 for which the citation was issued and, when duly sworn to and filed with a court of competent jurisdiction, prosecution may 191 proceed under that complaint. For the purposes of this paragraph, 192 193 the fact that any person is found to have a brush or debris pile 194 or other material which is or was being burned and reasonable and 195 prudent efforts were not taken to prevent the spread of the fire

| 199 | (k) To discharge such duties, responsibilities and |
| 200 | powers necessary to accomplish and implement the forestry |
| 201 | inventory and strategic planning act under Section 49-19-401 et |
| 202 | seq. |
| 203 | SECTION 3. Section 49-19-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is |
| 204 | amended as follows: |
| 205 | 49-19-1. (1) There shall be a State Forestry Commission |
| 206 | composed of $\underline{\text{ten }(10)}$ members, who shall be qualified electors of |
| 207 | the state. The Dean of the School of Forest Resources at |
| 208 | Mississippi State University shall be an ex officio member of the |
| 209 | commission, with full voting authority. The chairman of the |
| 210 | advisory committee to the Mississippi Institute for Forest |
| 211 | Inventory shall be an ex officio nonvoting member of the |
| 212 | commission. The Governor shall appoint eight (8) members, with |
| 213 | the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of six (6) years. |
| 214 | The Governor shall appoint one (1) member from each congressional |
| 215 | district as constituted at the time the appointments are made and |
| 216 | shall appoint the remainder of the members from the state at |
| 217 | large. A member from a congressional district must be a certified |
| 218 | tree farmer who owns eighty (80) or more acres of forest land or a |
| 219 | person who derives a major portion of his personal income from |
| 220 | forest-related business, industry or other related activities. |
| 221 | Members of the commission from the state at large may or may not |
| 222 | possess the same qualifications as members appointed from the |

(2) The members of the commission shall receive no annual salary but each member of the commission shall receive a per diem plus expenses and mileage as authorized by law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties. No member of the

congressional districts.

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- 228 commission shall receive total per diem in excess of twenty-four
- 229 (24) days' compensation per annum.
- 230 (3) If a vacancy occurs in the office of an appointed member
- 231 of the commission, the vacancy shall be filled by appointment for
- 232 the balance of the unexpired term.
- 233 (4) The commission shall elect from its membership a
- 234 chairman, who shall preside over meetings, and a vice chairman,
- 235 who shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the
- 236 chairman is excused.
- 237 (5) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- 238 governing times and places for meetings, and governing the manner
- 239 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall
- 240 take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Mississippi
- 241 Constitution and shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty
- 242 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of
- 243 State, conditioned according to law and payable to the State of
- 244 Mississippi before assuming the duties of office.
- 245 (6) Any appointment made to the commission contrary to this
- 246 section shall be void, and it is unlawful for the State Fiscal
- 247 Officer to pay any per diem or authorize the expenses of the
- 248 appointee.
- 249 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 250 and after July 1, 2006.
