Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 564

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 9 Section 41-29-537, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 10 which is a sunset provision for Sections 41-29-505 through
- 41-29-536, Mississippi Code of 1972, which constitute the 11
- 12 authority to seek a wiretap in certain drug cases, is repealed.
- **SECTION 2.** (1) The Director of the Bureau of Investigation 13
- 14 is authorized to retain on a contractual basis such persons as he
- 15 shall deem necessary to detect and apprehend violators of the
- criminal statutes of this state. 16
- 17 Those persons contracting with the Director of the
- 18 Bureau of Investigation pursuant to subsection (1) shall be known
- and hereinafter referred to as "special contract agents." 19
- 20 The investigative services provided for in this section
- 21 shall be designed to support local law enforcement efforts.
- 22 Special contract investigators shall have all powers
- 23 necessary and incidental to the fulfillment of their contractual
- obligations, including the power of arrest when authorized by the 24
- Director of the Bureau of Investigation. 25
- (5) No person shall be a special contract investigator 26
- unless he is at least twenty-one (21) years of age. 27
- 28 The Director of the Bureau of Investigation shall
- 29 conduct a background investigation of all potential special
- contract investigators. All contract agents must meet the minimum 30
- 31 standard requirements established by the Board on Law Enforcement
- Officer Standards and Training. 32
- Any contract pursuant to subsection (1) shall be: 33
- 34 Reduced to writing; and (a)

- 35 (b) Terminable upon written notice by either party, and
- shall in any event terminate one (1) year from the date of
- signing; and 37
- 38 Approved as to form by the Attorney General.
- Such contracts shall not be public records and shall not be 39
- 40 available for inspection under the provisions of a law providing
- for the inspection of public records as now or hereafter amended. 41
- 42 Special contract investigators shall not be considered
- employees of the Bureau of Investigation for any purpose. 43
- The Director of the Bureau of Investigation shall have 44
- 45 all powers necessary and incidental to the effective operation of
- this section. 46
- (10) Notwithstanding any other provisions contained in this 47
- section, all contracts authorized under this section and related 48
- 49 matters shall be made available to the Legislative Budget Office
- 50 and the Department of Finance and Administration.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 51
- 52 and after July 1, 2006.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
