## HOUSE BILL NO. 762

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 99-19-71, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW THE EXPUNCTION OF CERTAIN NONVIOLENT FELONIES FOR FIRST 2 3 OFFENDERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4

SECTION 1. Section 99-19-71, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5

amended as follows: 6

7 99-19-71. (1) Any person who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, excluding a conviction for a traffic violation, a 8 9 crime of violence or a crime involving the use of a firearm, and who is a first offender, may petition the justice, county, circuit 10 11 or municipal court, as may be applicable, for an order to expunge any such conviction from all public records. Upon entering such 12 order, a nonpublic record thereof shall be retained by the court 13 and by the Mississippi Criminal Information Center solely for the 14 purpose of determining whether, in subsequent proceedings, such 15 person is a first offender. The effect of such order shall be to 16 restore such person, in the contemplation of the law, to the 17 status he occupied before such arrest. No person as to whom such
