HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 116

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE, LEGACY AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS
2 OF MRS. BERTHA H. SMITH AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER
3 FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HER PASSING.

19 failed, Mother Smith served as a role model for both the young and

21 WHEREAS, Mother Smith was married to the late Andrew Smith,
22 Sr., and to this holy union the following eight children were
23 born: Hannah, Willie and Clarence, the late Andrew, Bertha and
24 Henry and infants Willie B. and Martha; and

25 WHEREAS, always the source of unwavering strength and
26 encouragement, Mother Smith was known to have a kind word and to
27 help anyone who was in need; and

28 WHEREAS, although Mother Smith has crossed the river of life
29 to now stand on golden heavenly shores, the legacy of her memory
30 will continue to live in the hearts of her survivors; and

31 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
32 commend the life of such an inspiring and caring individual as
33 Mrs. Bertha Hutchins Smith whose life was a beacon of light,
