SENATE BILL NO. 2613 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-55-71, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO EXTEND THE DATE BY WHICH AN ENTITY PROVIDING NONEMERGENCY 3 TRANSPORTATION SERVICES MAY CONTINUE TO PROVIDE SUCH SERVICES 4 WITHOUT FIRST RECEIVING A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO 5 PROVIDE THAT NEMT PROVIDERS THAT ARE MEDICAID PROVIDERS UNDER 6 CONTRACT WITH AN NEMT TRANSPORTATION BROKER PROVIDING SERVICES FOR 7 THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO HAVE A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE NEMT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES UNDER 8 9 CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. Section 41-55-71, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11

12 amended as follows:

13 41-55-71. (1) As used in this section, the following terms 14 shall be defined as provided in this subsection:

(a) "Department" means the State Department of Health.

(b) "Nonemergency medical transportation provider" or

17 "NEMT provider" means any company in the business of providing

NEMT transportation services for compensation and any person, 18

19 group of persons or entity that provides NEMT transportation

20 services for compensation. Any company with a current

21 accreditation from the Nonemergency Medical Transportation
22 Accreditation Commission (NEMTAC) is deemed to be a NEMT provider.

23 "NEMT transportation service" means motor vehicle (C) 24 transportation provided on a regular basis by a public or private 25 entity or person that is designed exclusively or primarily to 26 serve individuals who are elderly or disabled and who are unable 27 to use regular means of transportation but do not require 28 ambulance service. This term also means those nonemergency 29 medical transportation services that are provided under the 30 Medicaid nonemergency transportation program or by managed care 31 providers that have contracted with the Division of Medicaid, 32 except for those that are exempt from the permitting requirement 33 of this section under subsection (8).

34 (2) The department shall adopt rules providing for
35 applications for permits, issuance of permits, renewal of permits
36 and revocation of permits, and the department may provide for the
37 payment of fees for the issuance and renewal of permits.

38 (3) The department shall adopt by rule standards for the 39 operation of vehicles used to provide NEMT transportation service 40 that are reasonably necessary to protect the health and safety of 41 individuals using that service.

42 (4) Standards adopted under this section must include, but43 are not limited to:

No. 2613 23/SS26/R783SG PAGE 2 44 Qualifications of drivers and attendants, including (a) 45 driver training requirements that must be met before a driver provides special transportation, including, but not limited to: 46 47 (i) Fingerprint background check; 48 (ii) Annual criminal background checks, including 49 sex offender registry; (iii) Annual motor vehicle records (MVR) checks 50 51 from the Department of Public Safety; 52 (iv) Drug screens; 53 Regular confirmation that the driver does not (V) 54 appear on the Office of Inspector General (OIG) exclusion lists; 55 For drivers, appropriate training for the (vi) 56 mode of transportation being provided; 57 Safety of vehicles and necessary safety equipment; (b) 58 (C) General requirements concerning inspection and 59 maintenance of vehicles, replacement vehicles, standard vehicle 60 equipment, and specialized equipment necessary to ensure vehicle usability and safety for disabled persons; and 61 62 (d) Minimum insurance requirements. 63 A NEMT provider must meet all the requirements and (5) 64 standards set by the department for providing NEMT transportation 65 services. NEMT providers are required to have on hand at a location in the state and be able to produce upon request the 66 67 necessary documentation to prove compliance with the requirements and standards set by the department as provided in this section. 68

69 (6) The department is authorized to revoke the permit of, or 70 impose fines on, any NEMT provider that is found to be not in 71 compliance with the requirements and standards set by the 72 department for providing NEMT transportation services.

(7) The department is authorized to bring actions for injunctions in the name of the department to enjoin and prohibit any person or entity from providing NEMT transportation service in the state without having a current, valid permit from the department except as otherwise provided in this section.

78 (8) An NEMT provider that is a Medicaid provider under 79 contract with an NEMT transportation broker providing services for 80 the Division of Medicaid shall not be required to have a permit 81 from the department to provide NEMT transportation services if (a) 82 the broker periodically inspects the transport drivers for the 83 NEMT provider and the vehicles used by the transport drivers for 84 compliance with the standards prescribed in subsection (4) of this 85 section and any additional standards adopted by the department 86 under subsection (3) of this section, and (b) the NEMT broker 87 determines that the drivers and vehicles are in compliance with 88 those standards and certifies such compliance with the department. 89 The department shall not make its own inspection of any drivers 90 and vehicles that have been certified by an NEMT broker as 91 provided in this subsection. Any NEMT provider that is exempt 92 from the permitting requirement under this subsection shall be 93 required to register with the department.

94 (***<u>9</u>) Any public entity or private entity in the 95 business of providing nonemergency medical transportation services 96 may continue to provide such services without first receiving a 97 permit until July 1, * * <u>2024</u>, provided that it complies with 98 the other provisions of this section and the rules set by the 99 department.

After July 1, * * * <u>2024</u>, each nonemergency medical transportation provider must have a NEMT permit from the department before it may provide NEMT transportation services in Mississippi.

104 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 105 and after July 1, 2023.
