HOUSE BILL NO. 19

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-30-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSURE AS A LICENSED PROFESSIONAL 3 COUNSELOR TO ALLOW THE LICENSURE OF PERSONS WHO HAVE COMPLETED THE 4 REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL 5 HEALTH AND WHO HAVE TWO YEARS OF EXPERIENCE PROVIDING DIRECT 6 COUNSELING SERVICES AT A BOARD-APPROVED SITE WITH OR WITHOUT 7 SUPERVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 9 SECTION 1. Section 73-30-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 11 73-30-9. (1) The board shall issue a license as a provisional licensed professional counselor, without regard to 12 13 race, religion, sex or national origin, to each applicant who 14 furnishes satisfactory evidence of the following: 15 The applicant has completed an application on a (a) 16 form prescribed by the board accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). 17 18 (b) The applicant is at least twenty-one (21) years of 19 age. 20 The applicant is of good moral character. (C)

The immigration document must be current and issued by the United States * * * <u>Citizenship and Immigration</u> Services.

(e) The applicant is not in violation of any of the
provisions of this article and the rules and regulations adopted
hereunder.

(f) The applicant shall have a minimum acceptable graduate semester hour or acceptable quarter-hour master's degree, as determined by the board, primarily in counseling or a related counseling field from a regionally or nationally accredited college or university program in counselor education or a related counseling program subject to board approval. All applicants shall provide official transcripts of all graduate work.

38 (h) A provisional license issued under this section
39 shall require that the individual confine one's practice to a
40 board-approved site and accrue counseling experience under the
41 supervision of a board-qualified supervisor.

42 (i) The limited license shall be renewable for not more
43 than four (4) years, with a nonrefundable license fee in the
44 amount provided in Section 73-30-29. Licensees may appeal to the
45 board for an extension of the renewal period.

Each applicant shall 49 50 submit a full set of the applicant's fingerprints in a form and 51 manner prescribed by the board, which shall be forwarded to the 52 Mississippi Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of 53 Investigation Identification Division for this purpose.

The board shall require each first-time applicant 95 (i) 96 for licensure or the initial privilege to practice and may require 97 applicants for license renewal to undergo a fingerprint-based criminal history records check of the Mississippi central criminal 98 99 database and the Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history 100 database. Each applicant for licensure and each renewal applicant as required by the board shall apply to undergo a 101 102 fingerprint-based criminal history records check of the 103 Mississippi central criminal database and the Federal Bureau of 104 Investigation criminal history database. Each applicant shall 105 submit a full set of the applicant's fingerprints in a form and manner prescribed by the board, which shall be forwarded to the 106 107 Mississippi Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of 108 Investigation Identification Division for this purpose.

109 (3) The board shall administer the privilege to practice in110 accordance with the Professional Counseling Compact.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2024.
