HOUSE BILL NO. 35

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-3-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH THE WISEWOMAN 3 AND WISEMAN PROGRAMS TO REDUCE THE INCIDENCES OF CERTAIN CHRONIC 4 DISEASES AMONG MISSISSIPPIANS THROUGH EDUCATION, PREVENTION AND 5 EARLY SCREENING AND DETECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAMS SHALL 6 BE IMPLEMENTED IN EACH COUNTY THAT IS LOCATED WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY 7 WEST OF INTERSTATE 55; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 41-3-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 10 amended as follows: 11 41-3-13. (1) The Legislature makes the following findings: 12 Chronic diseases are among the most prevalent, (a) 13 costly and preventable of all health problems. 14 Screening tests are currently available that can (b) detect heart disease, breast cancer, cervical cancer, colorectal 15 16 cancer, prostate cancer and other chronic diseases early, when they can be most effectively treated, managed or controlled. 17 18 (c) The risk factors for many chronic diseases can be addressed and reduced through education about those risk factors 19

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20 and the importance of actions that can be taken for prevention of 21 chronic diseases.

(d) People should partner with their health care providers to have their risk factors assessed, monitored and managed in accordance with national guidelines, and should be educated about the signs and symptoms of heart attack and stroke and the importance of getting help quickly at the onset of those symptoms.

(e) Mississippi should have programs that are
specifically designed to reduce the incidences of chronic diseases
among our population.

The State Department of Health * * * shall establish the 31 (2)32 WISEWOMAN * * * program and the WISEMAN * * * program, the purposes and goals of which are to reduce the incidences of 33 34 certain chronic diseases among Mississippians through education, 35 prevention and early screening and detection. * * * The WISEWOMAN 36 and WISEMAN programs shall be implemented in each county that is located wholly or partially west of Interstate 55. The focus of 37 38 the WISEWOMAN * * * program shall be heart disease, stroke, breast 39 cancer, cervical cancer and colorectal cancer in women, and the 40 focus of the WISEMAN * * * program shall be heart disease, stroke, prostate cancer, colorectal cancer and diabetes in men. At a 41 minimum, the WISEWOMAN and WISEMAN * * * programs shall: 42

43 (a) Provide for education about healthy behaviors and
44 how to reduce the risk factors for those chronic diseases;

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45 (b) Provide for screening and testing to detect those
46 chronic diseases early when they can be effectively treated,
47 managed or controlled; and

48 (c) Be directed toward those populations at greatest49 need and be based on a foundation of scientific evidence.

50 (3) In implementing the WISEWOMAN and WISEMAN * * *
51 programs, the department shall contract with public or private
52 clinics or agencies that have demonstrated success in reducing
53 incidences of those chronic diseases through education, prevention
54 and early screening and detection.

55 (4) The department shall seek and apply for grants from the 56 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and other public or 57 private entities to obtain funding for the WISEWOMAN and 58 WISEMAN * * * programs.

59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after July 1, 2024.
