HOUSE BILL NO. 116

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-1-55, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (MDA) TO CONDUCT A 3 YEARLY STUDY AND PROVIDE A LEGISLATIVE REPORT THAT IDENTIFIES THE 4 PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE CONDITIONS AND NEEDS OF CERTAIN COUNTIES 5 WITH THE HIGHEST PERCENTAGES OF POVERTY WITHIN THE STATE; TO REQUIRE MDA TO PROVIDE GUIDANCE AND ASSISTANCE TO SUCH COUNTIES TO 6 7 ASSIST THE COUNTIES IN IMPROVING THEIR PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURES; AND 8 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10 SECTION 1. Section 57-1-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11 amended as follows:

12 57-1-55. (1) The Mississippi Development Authority shall have the following general powers and duties: To develop and 13 14 manage programs which enhance the climate for economic growth through assistance to private sector businesses, local communities 15 16 and individuals, and through an extensive national and international marketing effort. 17 The Mississippi Development Authority shall have the 18 (2)19 following general powers and duties with respect to economic

20 development:

21 To plan, supervise and direct an active program of (a) 22 solicitation of industries to locate within the state; 23 To prepare, maintain and disseminate information (b) which is needed by companies in evaluating site locations; 24 25 (C) To consult with, advise and assist prospective 26 industries wishing to locate within the state; 27 To encourage new or expanding industries, which (d) 28 will add to the economy, to locate within the state; 29 To maintain a coordinated liaison function with (e) 30 other development groups, including state and federal agencies, 31 and planning and development districts, utility companies, chambers of commerce and railroads; 32 33 (f) To assist communities and counties within the state in preparation for economic growth; 34 35 To assist new and existing business and industry (a) 36 and encourage their development and expansion; 37 To plan and conduct a nationwide advertising (h) program promoting the state to prospective industry. Any contract 38 39 entered into for such purposes shall be advertised, bid and 40 accepted in accordance with the same procedure as prescribed for 41 the advertisement and acceptance of bids for the purchase of 42 commodities and contracts for public purchases under Chapter 7, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972; 43 44 (i) To work with economic development agencies of the

45 federal government in areas of industrial development and provide

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(j) To work with the Department of Corrections,
pursuant to the provisions of Section 47-5-501 et seq., in
identifying and evaluating acceptable industries and businesses
and in acting as an agent of the Department of Corrections by
communicating with such concerns and aggressively soliciting their
participation in the Correctional Industries Work Program;

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(k) To perform related work as required;

(1) To disseminate information about financial and other programs of the Mississippi Development Authority that will assist in the creation or expansion of industries processing wood products in this state;

(m) To market processed and raw agricultural productsdomestically and abroad;

To aid in the establishment of business incubation 61 (n) 62 centers by private business interests, not-for-profit corporations, and/or governmental entities. The department may 63 64 provide funds by contract for the establishment of business 65 incubation centers and may contract for space in which business 66 incubation centers will be located. Business incubation centers 67 are defined as facilities and support services that encourage the establishment of successful small businesses by providing a 68 69 short-term sheltered environment. The department may solicit and 70 accept grants and other financial aid or support from private or

71 public sources to aid in the development of business incubation 72 In addition, advice and assistance to established centers. 73 business incubation centers may be provided by the department; 74 To employ licensed real estate brokers and (0)75 appraisers necessary for the industrial development of any real 76 estate under the ownership or control of the Mississippi 77 Development Authority. Any contract entered into for such 78 purposes shall be advertised, bid and accepted in accordance with 79 the same procedure as prescribed for the advertisement and 80 acceptance of bids for the purchase of commodities and contracts 81 for public purchases under Chapter 7, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972; * * * 82

83 (p) * * * To establish, administer, manage, make expenditures and allocations from the Forestry Facility Grant 84 Program under the provisions of Section 57-1-781 * * *; and 85 86 (q) To study and identify annually the pubic infrastructure 87 needs of the twenty (20) counties with the highest percentages of poverty within the state and to report to the Legislature 88 89 regarding its findings by December 31 of each year. In addition, 90 the counties described in this paragraph shall be given guidance 91 and assistance by the Mississippi Development Authority in seeking 92 loans, grants and other financial assistance from federal and 93 state sources to assist such counties to improve the public 94 infrastructures.

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95 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 96 and after July 1, 2024.

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
