HOUSE BILL NO. 933

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 41-123-1, 41-123-3, 41-123-5 AND 41-123-7 AND 41-123-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO TRANSFER THE OFFICE OF MISSISSIPPI PHYSICIAN WORKFORCE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 41-123-11 AND 41-123-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR THE PURPOSE OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 41-123-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 41-123-1. There is established the Office of Mississippi
- 11 Physician Workforce within the * * * State Department of Health
- 12 for the purpose of overseeing the physician workforce development
- 13 and needs, both in numbers and distribution, of the State of
- 14 Mississippi. The office shall have a director, who must be a
- 15 physician licensed in the State of Mississippi and who shall be
- 16 appointed by the State Health Officer. In addition, the office
- 17 shall have a researcher to assist the director in collecting and
- 18 analyzing data concerning the physician workforce needs of
- 19 Mississippi and other necessary staff to assist in its work. The
- 20 office shall have the following duties, at a minimum:

21	(a)	Assessing	the	current	numhers	ages	tunes	\circ f
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- 22 practice, hospital affiliations, and geographic distribution of
- 23 physicians in each medical specialty in Mississippi;
- 24 (b) Assessing the current and future physician
- 25 workforce needs of the State of Mississippi;
- 26 (c) Assisting in the creation and/or support of
- 27 Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)
- 28 accredited GME training programs in the State of Mississippi based
- 29 on needs analysis and criteria established by the office and the
- 30 advisory board while maintaining a strong and continued priority
- 31 focus on family medicine. This support may include the awarding
- 32 of state financial assistance as available, for the creation or
- 33 support of family medicine residencies and other GME programs
- 34 approved by the advisory board;
- 35 (d) Encouraging the development of an adequate and
- 36 geographically distributed physician workforce in all specialties
- 37 for the State of Mississippi with an evolving strategic plan; and
- 38 (e) Providing an annual report to the Governor, the
- 39 Legislature, * * * and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions
- 40 of Higher Learning on the current status of the physician
- 41 workforce and training programs in Mississippi.
- 42 **SECTION 2.** Section 41-123-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 41-123-3. (1) The Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce
- 45 shall be administered by * * * the State Department of Health. An

- 46 advisory board shall be created to assist \star \star the department in
- 47 achieving the purpose of this chapter to be known as the
- 48 "Mississippi Physician Workforce Advisory Board." The advisory
- 49 board shall be composed of the following members:
- 50 (a) * * *Two (2) physicians appointed by and from the
- 51 membership of the Mississippi State Medical Association for a term
- 52 of three (3) years. Any member appointed under this paragraph may
- 53 be reappointed for two (2) additional terms.
- (* * *b) Two (2) physicians appointed by and from the
- 55 membership of the Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians for a
- 56 term of three (3) years. Any member appointed under this
- 57 paragraph may be reappointed for two (2) additional terms.
- (* * *c) One (1) physician appointed by and from the
- 59 membership of each of the following organizations, whose terms
- 60 shall be for three (3) years and who may be reappointed for two
- 61 (2) additional terms:
- 62 (i) Mississippi Osteopathic Medical Association;
- 63 (ii) Mississippi Chapter, American College of
- 64 Physicians;
- 65 (iii) Mississippi Chapter, American Academy of
- 66 Pediatrics;
- 67 (iv) Mississippi Chapter, American College of
- 68 OB-GYN; and

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69 (v) Mississippi Medical and Surgical Association.

- 70 (* * $\star \underline{d}$) Two (2) physician designees of the Dean of
- 71 the University of Mississippi School of Medicine, who will serve
- 72 at the will and pleasure of the dean. One (1) of the members
- 73 appointed under this paragraph must be responsible for Graduate
- 74 Medical Education at the University of Mississippi School of
- 75 Medicine.
- 76 (* * *e) The Chair of the Department of Family
- 77 Medicine at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine.
- 78 (* * *f) A member of the State Board of Medical
- 79 Licensure, who will serve at the will and pleasure of that board.
- 80 (* * *g) One (1) physician designee of the Dean of the
- 81 William Carey School of Medicine, who will serve at the will and
- 82 pleasure of the dean.
- 83 (* * *h) One (1) representative of the Mississippi
- 84 Economic Council appointed by the president of the council, and
- 85 who will serve at the will and pleasure of the president.
- 86 (* * *i) One (1) representative of the Mississippi
- 87 Development Authority appointed by the executive director of the
- 88 authority, who will serve at the will and pleasure of the
- 89 executive director.
- 90 (***j) One (1) representative of the Mississippi
- 91 Hospital Association, who will serve at the will and pleasure of
- 92 the association.

- 93 (***k) Two (2) representatives of the Mississippi
- 94 Primary Health Care Association, who will serve at the will and
- 95 pleasure of the association.
- 96 (2) Vacancies on the advisory board must be filled in a
- 97 manner consistent with the original appointments.
- 98 (3) * * * The advisory board * * * shall establish rules for
- 99 transacting its business. A majority of the members of the
- 100 advisory board shall constitute a quorum at all advisory board
- 101 meetings. An affirmative vote of a majority of the members
- 102 present and voting shall be required in the making of
- 103 recommendations by the advisory board. * * * The advisory board
- 104 shall elect a chair and vice chair from * * * among its
- 105 members * * *. The chair shall serve for a term of two (2) years,
- 106 upon the expiration of which the vice chair shall assume the
- 107 office of chair.
- 108 (4) * * * The advisory board shall hold no less than two (2)
- 109 meetings annually.
- 110 (5) The advisory board may form an executive committee for
- 111 the purpose of transacting business that must be conducted before
- 112 the next regularly scheduled meeting of the advisory board. All
- 113 actions taken by the executive committee must be ratified by the
- 114 advisory board at its next regularly scheduled meeting.
- 115 (6) Members of the advisory board shall serve without
- 116 compensation, but may be reimbursed, subject to the availability
- 117 of funding, for mileage and actual and necessary expenses incurred

118	in	attending	meetings	of	the	advisory	board <u>,</u>	as	provided	in
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- 119 Section 25-3-41.
- 120 (7) The advisory board shall be housed at the * * * State
- 121 Department of Health.
- SECTION 3. Section 41-123-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 123 amended as follows:
- 124 41-123-5. The Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce
- 125 shall have the following powers and duties, at a minimum:
- 126 (a) Developing the administrative policy for the
- 127 advisory board and the office * * *;
- 128 (b) Developing and implementing strategies and
- 129 activities for the office and for the implementation of an
- 130 evolving strategic plan to provide for the physician workforce
- 131 needs of Mississippi. In developing these strategies, the Office
- 132 of Mississippi Physician Workforce and the advisory board shall
- 133 seek the input of various organizations and entities including the
- 134 Mississippi State Medical Association, the Mississippi Academy of
- 135 Family Physicians, the Mississippi Chapters of the American
- 136 College of Physicians, American Academy of Pediatrics, and
- 137 American College of OB-GYN, the Mississippi Medical and Surgical
- 138 Association, and the Mississippi Osteopathic Medicine Association;
- 139 (c) Establishing a budget to support the activities of
- 140 the office and periodically reviewing and if appropriate,
- 141 revising, that budget to meet its mission; and

142	(d) \star \star Reviewing the activities of the office and	d
143	guiding the office in accomplishing the strategic goal of	
144	providing Mississippi's physician workforce needs.	

- SECTION 4. Section 41-123-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 41-123-7. (1) The advisory board shall recommend policies
 and procedures for the awarding of state funding that creates
 and/or provides sustaining support for the desired number of ACGME
 accredited Family Medicine residency programs and other valued and
 needed ACGME residencies approved by the advisory board that will
 accept both M.D. and D.O. students.
- 153 * * * Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce, with 154 the input of the advisory board, shall have the authority to award 155 financial support, from funds specifically appropriated for that purpose by the Legislature, of up to Three Million Dollars 156 157 (\$3,000,000.00) to any hospital or entity with demonstrated 158 commitment and resources, as determined by * * * office, with input from the advisory board, to establish and operate an ACGME 159 160 accredited Family Medicine residency program or other GME program 161 qualifying under subsection (1) of this section. The funds will be dispersed at the determination of * * * $\frac{1}{2}$ office, with input from 162 163 the advisory board, and may include start-up funding and/or 164 provide sustaining support for residency programs.
- 165 (3) Each applicant for state financial support for creation 166 of an ACGME residency program as authorized under this section

- 167 must submit an application to * * * the office * * * that conforms
- 168 to requirements established by this chapter and by * * * the
- 169 office, with input from the advisory board.
- 170 (4) In selecting recipients for state financial support
- 171 authorized under this section, following criteria and
- 172 recommendations from the advisory board, * * * the office may use
- 173 its discretion to award funding based on demographic needs and the
- 174 future success of the residency program.
- 175 (5) An applicant for state financial support for creation of
- 176 an ACGME accredited residency program may receive funding only
- 177 upon approval of * * * office, with input from the advisory board.
- SECTION 5. Section 41-123-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 179 amended as follows:
- 41-123-9. (1) Hospitals, other entities and/or residency
- 181 programs must adhere to the policies and practices as stipulated
- 182 by the Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce to continue
- 183 receiving state financial support under this chapter.
- 184 (2) Hospitals, other entities and/or residency programs may
- 185 receive state financial support that may be provided by the
- 186 office * * * pursuant to this chapter. Any financial support
- 187 awarded by the office * * * must be used for only the creation of
- 188 a residency or for residency operational expenses, or the
- 189 recipient will be liable for repayment of any financial support
- 190 received under this chapter.

191	SECTION 6. Section 41-123-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
L92	brought forward as follows:
L93	41-123-11. Any residency program established with state
L94	financial support must at a minimum be capable of accepting
L95	students from both allopathic and osteopathic medical schools that
L96	are accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education
L97	(LCME) or the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation
L98	(COCA) of the American Osteopathic Association (AOA).
L99	SECTION 7. Section 41-123-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
200	brought forward as follows:
201	41-123-13. Funding for the operation of the Office of
202	Mississippi Physician Workforce and the Mississippi Physician
203	Workforce Advisory Board, including the salary of the director of
204	the office and all necessary staff, shall be paid from funds
205	specifically appropriated for that purpose by the Legislature.
206	SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from
207	and after July 1, 2024
