HOUSE BILL NO. 994

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR RECEIPTS UNDER THE 3 MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE 4 THAT GRANT AWARDS SHALL BE BASED ON AN ADJUSTED GROSS INCOME AS DETERMINED BY THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID 5 6 (FAFSA); TO REVISE THE CAP ON AWARD AMOUNTS BASED ON THE PERCENTAGE THRESHOLDS OF THE MEDIAN INCOME FOR A FAMILY OF FOUR IN 7 THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 10 SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 11 amended as follows:

12 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant (MTAG) Program for college or 13 14 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial 15 16 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, * * * which shall set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under 17 this section. The board shall establish such rules and 18 19 regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the 20 purposes and intent of this section.

21	(2) To be eligible to receive Mississippi Resident Tuition
22	Assistance Grant (MTAG) award, a student must meet the following
23	qualifications:
24	(a) Be a resident of the State of Mississippi, which
25	such residency status, for the purpose of receiving grant funds
26	under the MTAG Program, shall be determined in the same manner as
27	resident status for tuition purposes is prescribed in Sections
28	37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with exception being given to Section
29	<u>37-103-17;</u>
30	(b) Complete the Free Application for Federal Student
31	Aid (FAFSA) every year for which the student wishes to be
32	considered for aid by the deadline established by the board;
33	(c) Complete the Mississippi Aid Application (MAAPP)
34	every year for which the student wishes to be considered for aid
35	by the deadline established by the board; and
36	(d) Have received acceptance for enrollment at any
37	state institution of higher learning, public community or junior
38	college located in this, or any regionally accredited,
39	state-approved, nonprofit two-year or four-year college or
40	university located in this state and approved by the board.
41	(* * * <u>3</u>) The board shall approve * * * <u>Mississippi Resident</u>
42	<u>Tuition Assistance Grant</u> to \star \star \star freshmen, sophomore, junior and
43	senior Mississippi residents who * * * <u>enroll, on at least a</u>
44	half-time basis, at any state institution of higher learning or

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45 <u>any four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit</u> 46 college or university located in this state.

47 (* * *4) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants * * * shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, books, 48 49 materials and fees not to exceed the student's total cost of 50 attendance. Awards shall be scaled based upon the adjusted gross income (AGI) as determined by the completion of the Free 51 52 Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), as follows: 53 (a) For students from families making at or above one 54 hundred percent (100%) of the median family income for a family of four (4) in Mississippi, the award shall not exceed One Thousand 55 56 Dollars (\$1,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state 57 institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and 58 universities in Mississippi, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) 59 60 for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher 61 learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or 62 63 four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per 64 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of 65 attendance * * *; 66 (b) For students from families making between fifty-one

67 <u>percent (51%) and ninety-nine percent (99%) of the median family</u> 68 income for a family of four (4) in Mississippi, the award shall

69 not exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for

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70	junior and senior students attending state institutions of higher
71	learning in Mississippi or four-year regionally accredited, state
72	approved, nonprofit colleges and universities in Mississippi, and
73	Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for freshmen and sophomores
74	attending state institutions of higher learning or public
75	community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or regionally
76	accredited, state approved, nonprofit two-year or four-year
77	colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per term, semester
78	or quarter of the academic year for costs of attendance; and
79	(c) For students from families making at or below fifty
80	percent (50%) of the median family income for a family of four (4)
81	in Mississippi, the award shall not exceed Two Thousand Dollars
82	(\$2,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state
83	institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year
84	regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and
85	universities in Mississippi, and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)
86	for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher
87	learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or
88	regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or
89	four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per
90	term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of
91	attendance.

93 (5) By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance94 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and

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95 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's 96 eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 97 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be 98 99 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 100 receive a grant shall be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars 101 102 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the 103 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 104 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully 105 obtained.

106 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
107 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
108 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
109 student shall:

(a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
Progress Standards and certified by the institution's

115 $(* * *\underline{b})$ Have a cumulative grade point average of at 116 least 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester 117 or trimester or term.

119 Tuition Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient

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122 (* * *<u>8</u>) In order for an institution to remain eligible for 123 its students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 124 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 125 following requirements:

(a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant * * *;

130 (b) The institution is required to make refunds to the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds 131 132 which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of 133 students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment 134 during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year 135 if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a 136 refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the 137 138 institution in such instance * * *; and

140 (***<u>c</u>) The board may conduct its own annual audits 141 of any institution participating in the Mississippi Resident 142 Tuition Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke 143 an institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the 144 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the

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148 (***<u>9</u>) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident 149 Tuition Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or 150 quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one 151 (1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.

152 (* * *10) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent 153 Scholars Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible 154 to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant 155 pursuant to this section unless he is eligible for such award 156 after the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered 157 by the board when conducting an assessment of the financial 158 resources available to the student. In no case shall any student 159 receive any combination of student financial aid that would exceed 160 the cost of attendance * * *.

(11) For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean,
but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in
eligible institutions approved by the board.

164 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 165 and after July 1, 2024.
