## SENATE BILL NO. 2082

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-144-7, 37-144-11, 37-144-13 AND 37-144-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ADD GENERAL SURGERY AS A POSSIBLE CAREER PATH FOR THOSE IN THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-144-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 37-144-7. (1) The commission shall develop and implement
- 9 policies and procedures designed to recruit, identify and enroll
- 10 undergraduate students who demonstrate necessary interest,
- 11 commitment, aptitude and academic achievement to pursue careers as
- 12 family physicians, general surgeons or other generalist physicians
- in rural or medically underserved areas of Mississippi, and to
- 14 develop and implement the programs designed to foster successful
- 15 entry of participants into medical school, completion of medical
- 16 school, enrollment into and completion of family medicine or other
- 17 generalist residency, and establishment and maintenance of a
- 18 career in family medicine, general surgery or other generalist
- 19 specialty in a rural or underserved area of Mississippi.

- The commission, in conjunction with the University of 23 (3) 24 Mississippi Medical Center, shall have the authority to provide 25 students selected for scholarship funding with faculty mentors and other programs designed to enhance the students' likelihood of 26 admission to the medical school. The commission and the 27 28 University of Mississippi Medical Center will develop coursework 29 that will provide scholarship students with the skills necessary 30 for sustained and successful medical practice in rural 31 Mississippi.
- 32 (4) Each applicant for admission to the program must submit 33 an application to the commission that conforms to requirements 34 established by the commission.
- 35 (5) In selecting participants for the program, the board may 36 only accept an applicant if his or her academic record and other 37 characteristics, if given consideration by the University of 38 Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee, would be 39 considered credible and competitive.
- 40 (6) An applicant for the program may be admitted only upon a 41 majority vote of the members of the commission.
- 42 (7) Not less than fifteen (15) students will be admitted to 43 the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program each year,

- 44 provided that there are fifteen (15) or more qualified applicants
- 45 for the program.
- 46 (8) Upon the funding of sixty-one (61) or more rural
- 47 physicians scholarships by the Legislature and recognizing the
- 48 importance of balancing the needs of comprehensive primary care
- 49 along with a critical shortage of psychiatrists in Mississippi,
- 50 the commission may grant an exception for fourth-year medical or
- 51 osteopathic school (M4) students who demonstrate a desire to
- 52 practice psychiatry in rural Mississippi and who use a practice
- 53 model and enter the practice of medicine in a rural or underserved
- 54 area in Mississippi, as defined by the commission, beginning for
- 55 the M4 Class of 2020.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-144-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 57 amended as follows:
- 37-144-11. (1) Students in the program may apply to any
- 59 medical or osteopathic school that is accredited by the Liaison
- 60 Committee on Medical Education (LCME) or the American Osteopathic
- 61 Association (AOA).
- 62 (2) Students in the program seeking admission to the
- 63 University of Mississippi School of Medicine shall be eliqible for
- 64 a special admissions process pursuant to criteria established by
- 65 the School of Medicine Admissions Committee which will include
- 66 special consideration of the attributes of participation in the
- 67 program.

- 68 In carrying out the admissions process developed for the 69 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program participants 70 under this section, the goal is for the program to work with the 71 School of Medicine to enhance the capability of participants to 72 successfully enter and complete medical school, train in family 73 medicine, general surgery or other generalist primary care 74 specialty and enter practice in rural or underserved areas in 75 Mississippi. To the extent feasible, the early admissions process 76 should be completed before November 1 of the year preceding a 77 student's admission to medical school.
- 78 SECTION 3. Section 37-144-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 79 amended as follows:
  - 37-144-13. (1) Subject to the availability of funding, students in the program who successfully matriculate to medical or osteopathic school are eligible for ongoing financial support in accordance with policies and requirements of the commission and in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations. The number of students to be supported at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine and at other schools will be established by policy prescribed by the commission.
  - Subject to the availability of funding, students enrolled at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine may receive tuition support, funding to assist with the cost of books and a living stipend, as prescribed by policy of the commission and in accordance with applicable regulations. - 93 ongoing funding must be given to those students admitted to the 94 University of Mississippi School of Medicine.
- 95 For each year that a student in medical or osteopathic school receives financial assistance, the student is obligated for 96 97 one (1) year of practice as a primary care physician or general 98 surgeon in a rural or underserved area in Mississippi. Breach of the agreement at any stage of training shall invoke the repayment 99 100 of all financial assistance provided to the student through the 101 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program, including 102 assistance provided during undergraduate school, as well as in
- 104 be prescribed in policy by the commission. 105 SECTION 4. Section 37-144-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 107 37-144-15. Medical and osteopathic students in the program 108 must enter family medicine, general surgery or other generalist 109 residency programs according to their choice of specialty.
- Depending upon the availability of funds, students who 110
- 111 successfully enter residency programs which have been approved by
- 112 the commission may receive further financial support from the
- 113 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program subject to
- 114 applicable rules and policies of the commission. All funding for
- financial support from the commission to participants during their 115
- 116 residency must be disbursed in accordance with applicable
- 117 regulations.
