## SENATE BILL NO. 2154

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A CHILD SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE VACCINE 3 REQUIREMENTS IN ORDER TO ATTEND SCHOOL IF THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OR ADULT WHO HAS ASSUMED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CHILD'S CARE AND 4 5 CUSTODY IN THE CASE OF A MINOR, OR THE CHILD SEEKING ADMISSION IF 6 AN EMANCIPATED MINOR, SUBMITS TO THEIR COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT A COMPLETED RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION REQUEST THAT DOCUMENTS WHICH 7 REQUIRED VACCINATIONS HAVE BEEN GIVEN, AND WHICH VACCINATIONS HAVE 8 9 NOT BEEN GIVEN ON THE BASIS THAT THEY ARE CONTRARY TO HIS OR HER 10 RELIGIOUS BELIEFS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT 11 SHALL SUBMIT THE REQUEST TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO 12 REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ACCEPT AND ISSUE A 13 CERTIFICATE OF RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION IF THE REQUEST INCLUDES ALL OF THE REQUIRED COMPONENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 14 HEALTH SHALL PROMULGATE A RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION REQUEST FORM THAT 15 16 MUST INCLUDE CERTAIN STATEMENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT A CHILD MAY STILL 17 BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL IF ANY VACCINE-PREVENTABLE DISEASE FOR 18 WHICH THE CHILD HAS NOT BEEN IMMUNIZED IS OCCURRING OR THREATENING 19 TO OCCUR IN THE COMMUNITY; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHILD SHALL NOT RETURN TO SCHOOL UNTIL THE OUTBREAK HAS BEEN RESOLVED AND THE 20 21 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH APPROVES THE RETURN TO SCHOOL; AND FOR 22 RELATED PURPOSES.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

24 SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

25 amended as follows:

41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer
shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered

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28 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 29 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary.

30 (2) Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful for any child to attend any school, kindergarten or similar type 31 facility intended for the instruction of children (hereinafter 32 33 called "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of 34 any legitimate home instruction program as defined in Section 37-13-91, **\* \* \*** for ten (10) or **\* \* \*** fewer children who are 35 36 related within the third degree computed according to the civil law to the operator, unless they shall first have been vaccinated 37 38 against those diseases specified by the State Health Officer.

39 <u>(3)</u> A certificate of exemption from vaccination for medical 40 reasons may be offered on behalf of a child by a duly licensed 41 physician and may be accepted by the local health officer when, in 42 his opinion, such exemption will not cause undue risk to the 43 community.

44 While seeking to attend any school, a child shall (4) (a) not be required to comply with the requirements of this section 45 46 for any specific vaccination in order to attend the school if the 47 parent or guardian or adult who has assumed responsibility for the 48 child's care and custody in the case of a minor, or the child 49 seeking admission if an emancipated minor, submits to their County 50 Health Department a completed Religious Exemption Request that 51 documents which required vaccinations have been given, and which 52 vaccinations have not been given on the basis that they are

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53	contrary to his or her religious beliefs. The County Health		
54	Department shall submit the Request to the State Department of		
55	Health. The State Department of Health shall accept and issue a		
56	Certificate of Religious Exemption if the request includes all of		
57	the required components. The Department shall mail a copy of the		
58	Certificate of Religious Exemption to the parent, guardian,		
59	responsible adult or emancipated minor, as the case may be, and		
60	the daycare or school indicated on the Religious Exemption		
61	Request.		
62	(b) The State Department of Health shall promulgate a		
63	Religious Exemption Request form that shall include, but not be		
64	limited to, the following:		
65	(i) A statement that the parent or guardian who		
66	has assumed responsibility for the child's care and custody, in		
67	the case of a minor, or the child seeking admission if an		
68	emancipated minor, has been informed by a health care practitioner		
69	and school district regarding the risks and benefits of receiving		
70	vaccinations or not receiving vaccinations; and		
71	(ii) A statement of understanding that:		
72	1. At the discretion of the Department of		
73	Health or local health officer, if any vaccine-preventable		
74	diseases for which the child has not been adequately immunized are		
75	occurring in or threatening to occur in the community, the child		
76	will, for the safety and benefit of the child and other children,		
77	be excluded from day care or school until the infectious disease		
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78 is no longer present or is no longer a threat to the safety and 79 welfare of the child or other children in the day care or school; 80 and

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2. The child or individual shall not return 82 to school until the outbreak has been resolved and the Department 83 of Health or local health officer approves the return to school.

84 (5) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local 85 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the 86 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only 87 acceptable means for showing compliance with these immunization 88 requirements, and the responsible school officials shall file the 89 form with the child's record.

90 If a child **\* \* \*** who is not exempt under subsection (4) (6) 91 of this section offers to enroll at a school without having 92 completed the required vaccinations, the local health officer may 93 grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for such completion 94 when, in the opinion of the health officer, such delay will not cause undue risk to the child, the school or the community. No 95 96 child shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1) dose 97 of each specified vaccine.

98 (7) Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall 99 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in 100 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health 101 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, 102

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103 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing 104 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination 105 by reason for such exemption.

106 <u>(8)</u> Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening 107 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge 108 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer 109 that all children enrolled who are not exempt under subsection (4) 110 of this section are in compliance with immunization requirements.

111 (9) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the 112 immunization status of the children, the local health officer, or 113 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished 114 certificates of immunization compliance by the school.

115 (10) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization. 116 117 Except for the children who are exempt under subsection (4) of 118 this section, any child not in compliance at the end of ninety 119 (90) days from the opening of the fall term must be suspended until in compliance, unless the health officer shall attribute the 120 121 delay to lack of supply of vaccine or some other such factor 122 clearly making compliance impossible.

123 <u>(11)</u> Failure to enforce provisions of this section shall 124 constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction be punishable by fine 125 or imprisonment or both.

126 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 127 and after July 1, 2024.

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
