SENATE BILL NO. 2339

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-16-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL DEVELOP A 3 CURRICULUM RELATED TO THE STUDY OF SIGN LANGUAGE WHICH SHALL COUNT 4 AS AN ACADEMIC CREDIT FOR FOREIGN LANGUAGES FOR THE PURPOSES OF 5 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-16-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 37-16-7. (1) Each district school board shall establish 9 10 standards for graduation from its schools which shall include as a 11 minimum: 12 (a) Mastery of minimum academic skills as measured by assessments developed and administered by the State Board of 13 14 Education. 15 (b) Completion of a minimum number of academic credits, 16 and all other applicable requirements prescribed by the district 17 school board. 18 (c) By school, information on high school graduation rates. High schools with graduation rates lower than eighty 19

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20 percent (80%) must submit a detailed plan to the Mississippi 21 Department of Education to restructure the high school experience 22 to improve graduation rates.

(2) A student who meets all requirements prescribed in
subsection (1) of this section shall be awarded a standard diploma
in a form prescribed by the State Board of Education.

(3) The State Board of Education may establish student
 proficiency standards for promotion to grade levels leading to
 graduation.

(4) The State Board of Education shall develop a curriculum
 related to the study of sign language. Any such class developed
 by the board may count as an academic credit for foreign languages
 for the purposes of high school graduation requirements.
 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
 and after July 1, 2024.
