## SENATE BILL NO. 2725

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI UNIVERSITY SYSTEM 2 EFFICIENCY TASK FORCE" CREATED TO EXAMINE THE EFFICIENCY AND 3 EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PUBLIC UNIVERSITY SYSTEM IN MISSISSIPPI, AS 4 IT RELATES TO THE UNIVERSITIES' COLLECTIVE MISSION OF ENROLLING 5 AND GRADUATING MORE DEGREED MISSISSIPPIANS AND RETAINING THEM IN 6 THE STATE, AND ANTICIPATED NATIONWIDE CHALLENGES WITH REGARD TO 7 DEMOGRAPHIC SHIFTS AND A PROJECTED OVERALL DECLINE IN ENROLLMENT; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE 8 9 LEGISLATURE ON CHANGES TO POLICY AND LAWS IN MISSISSIPPI WITH A 10 GOAL OF INCREASING THE EFFICIENCY OF THE PUBLIC UNIVERSITY SYSTEM 11 IN THE STATE; TO SET THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE 12 FOR OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED THERETO, INCLUDING PER DIEM AND 13 VOTING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is hereby established the "Mississippi 16 University System Efficiency Task Force" created to examine the 17 efficiency and effectiveness of the public university system in Mississippi, as it relates to the universities' collective mission 18 19 of enrolling and graduating more degreed Mississippians and retaining them in the state, and anticipated nationwide challenges 20 21 with regard to demographic shifts and a projected overall decline 22 in enrollment. The task force shall develop recommendations to the Legislature on changes to policy and laws in Mississippi with 23

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a goal of increasing the efficiency of the public university system in Mississippi, planning for future demographic shifts and possible enrollment declines at all institutions and the state level, and continuing progression toward the goal of increasing the post-secondary education attainment level in the state.

The members of the task force shall be as follows:

30 (a) The Chairmen of the Universities and Colleges
 31 Committees of the Mississippi Senate and Mississippi House of
 32 Representatives, or their designees from their respective
 33 committee membership;

34 (b) The Chairmen of the Appropriation Committees of the
35 Mississippi Senate and the Mississippi House of Representatives,
36 or their designees from their respective committee membership;

37 (c) The Chairmen of the Finance Committee of the
38 Mississippi Senate and the Ways and Means Committee of the
39 Mississippi House of Representatives, or their designees from
40 their respective committee membership;

41 (d) The Director of the University Research Center and
42 State Economist, or his or her designee;

43 (e) One (1) designee who holds an undergraduate degree
44 from one (1) of the four (4) public regional universities in
45 Mississippi appointed by the Governor. Such designee shall have
46 significant business or other professional experience and shall be
47 a resident of the State of Mississippi;

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(2)

(f) One (1) designee who holds an undergraduate degree from one (1) of the three (3) public historically black universities in Mississippi appointed by the Governor. Such designee shall have significant business or other professional experience and shall be a resident of the State of Mississippi; and

(g) One (1) designee who holds an undergraduate degree from one (1) of the four (4) public research universities in Mississippi appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. Such designee shall have significant business or other professional experience and shall be a resident of the State of Mississippi.

(3) The task force shall meet within forty-five (45) days of
the effective date of this act and shall evaluate the current
data, resources, and laws and policies of the State of
Mississippi. Specifically, the task force shall:

(a) Evaluate the current funding formula and
appropriations process for the Mississippi public university
system, particularly as it relates to enrollment and graduation
rates;

(b) Evaluate the process of developing physical plant plans for Mississippi's public universities, including the use of enrollment data and projections in such plans and the Mississippi Institution of Higher Learning's role in determining collective system needs requiring additional state resources;

No. 2725 24/SS08/R1031 PAGE 3 (scm\kr) (c) Collect and analyze publicly available data and statistics related to enrollment and graduation rates and projections, with particular focus on the enrollment and graduation rates of Mississippi residents, as well as other data relating to shifting demographics, at all of Mississippi's public universities;

(d) Examine any existing or developing plans, both on
an individual public university and university system basis, to
address projected demographic shifts and enrollment declines;

81 (e) Evaluate successful strategies for addressing 82 challenges in efficiency and enrollment in the Mississippi 83 university system and across the nation, including current 84 partnerships across the system; and

(f) Review any other matters related to the above
issues or the efficiency and effectiveness of the public
university system in Mississippi.

(4) The task force may request the assistance of the
Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning and any other related
agency, entity or organization with expertise in higher education,
demographic, enrollment and other issues.

92 (5) The Chairmen of the Universities and Colleges Committees 93 in the Mississippi Senate and Mississippi House of Representatives 94 shall call the first meeting. The members of the task force shall 95 elect a Chair or co-Chairs from among the members at its first 96 meeting. The task force shall develop and report its findings and

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97 recommendations to the Mississippi Legislature on or before 98 October 1, 2024. A majority of the membership shall be required 99 to approve any final report and recommendation. Meetings of the 100 task force shall be held at the State Capitol; however, if it is 101 not feasible for the task force to hold an in-person meeting, the 102 task force may convene utilizing an online meeting platform that 103 is accessible for viewing by the public.

104 Subject to appropriations, members of the task force who (6) 105 are not state employees may be compensated at the per diem rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and reimbursed in accordance with 106 107 Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses incurred in the 108 performance of their duties. However, task force members may not 109 incur per diem, travel or other expenses unless previously 110 authorized by vote at a meeting of the task force, which action must be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting. Per diem 111 112 and expense payments made pursuant to this subsection may be paid 113 from any funds made available to the task force for that purpose.

(7) The Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
Evaluation and Expenditure Review shall provide necessary clerical
support for the meetings of the task force and the preparation of
the report.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2024.
