SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 537

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE REMARKABLE GROWTH AND
2 SUCCESS OF THE ATHLETIC PROGRAM AT WILLIAM CAREY UNIVERSITY AND
3 COMMENDING THESE HIGHER EDUCATION ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

4 WHEREAS, we join the students, coaches, faculty and
5 administration of William Carey University (WCU) in recognizing
6 the outstanding accomplishments of the Athletic Program over the
7 last two years; and

8 WHEREAS, in 2024 William Carey University was honored to
9 receive the prestigious Halbrook Award, along with students
10 Abigail Wickham and RJ Stinson. WCU was selected as this year's
11 Independent College and University recipient based off a five-year
12 graduation percentage of 82.93% of female athletes with 64.23% of
13 male athletes for an overall percentage of 73.58% for the period.
14 Abigail Wickham is a Biology major with a minor in Psychology and
15 is a member of the women's golf team with a 3.96 GPA. RJ Stinson
16 is a Physical Education major and member of the baseball team with
17 a 4.00 GPA; and



18 WHEREAS, the Halbrook Award recognizes colleges and
19 universities that maintain and achieve high academic standards for
20 student-athletes, thus encouraging high graduation rates. The
21 awards program is made possible through endowments from
22 Representative David M. Halbrook, who served in the Mississippi
23 House of Representatives for 26 years, and his brothers, John C.
24 and James G. Halbrook, all from Belzoni, Mississippi; and

25 WHEREAS, William Carey's higher education athletics

37 • **Halford's 1300th Win:**

38 Head Coach Bobby Halford picked up his 1300th career win,
39 becoming the 7th coach in NAIA history to accomplish this
40 achievement, as his Crusaders defeated #1 Southeastern (Fla.) 13-4
41 in the 66th Annual Avista NAIA World Series at Harris Field.
42 Halford is currently the all-time winningest coach in the State of



43 Mississippi. Also, during the 2023 season, Carey posted the most
44 wins in the state with 49;

45 • **Steve Knight as HOF and Winningest Coach in History of**
46 **State:**

47 Head Men's Basketball Coach Steve Knight was inducted in the
48 Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in 2015. His 753 wins makes him
49 the State of Mississippi's all-time winningest collegiate coach
50 and currently places him #1 in the NAIA among all active coaches
51 before the start of the 2023-2024 season;

67 2022-2023 Season - Bobby Halford (Baseball), Ryan McKenzie

71 • **New Sports of Swimming and Cheer Teams:**

72 WCU will have three new sports starting during the 2024-2025
73 year with the addition of Men's & Women's Swimming & Competitive
74 Cheer. Currently Carey has over 350 athletes that comprise its 18
75 intercollegiate varsity sports, two junior varsity sports, and one
76 co-ed club sport;

77 • **Number of All-Americans and Academic All-Americans:**

78 2022-2023 NAIA All-Americans - 44;
79 2022-2023 NAIA Scholar Athletes - 47;
80 2022-2023 SSAC All-Americans - 169;
81 2022-2023 SSAC All-Academic - 116;

82 • **Archery Awards and the Nations #1 Shooter:**

83 Samantha Roberts' performance at USA Archery's Indoor
84 Nationals will send her to Louisville, Kentucky, on March 14 to
85 compete with the top 8 archers in the Indoor Final. She placed
86 1st in Compound Collegiate, 1st Place Compound U21, and finished
87 fifth overall;

88 • **National Champion Runner-Ups in Two Sports:**

89 Currently this year, Women's Soccer and Women's Indoor Track
90 & Field finished as Runner-Up at the NAIA National Championships.



91 Men's Indoor Track & Field placed fourth overall at the NAIA
92 National Championship;

93 • **Commissioners Cup for Seven Years in a Row:**

94 William Carey has brought home the SSAC Commissioners Cup
95 seven years in row except for the 2019-2020 season due to COVID.
96 The Commissioners Cup is given annually to the member institution
97 with the most successful all-around sports program for the year.
98 Points are awarded based on how a team finishes in the regular
99 season (M&W Soccer, Volleyball, M&W Basketball, M&W Tennis,
100 Baseball and Softball) or the Conference Championship (M&W Cross
101 Country, Competitive Cheer, M&W Indoor Track & Field, M&W
102 Swimming, M&W Outdoor T&F and M&W Golf). There are bonus points
103 for winning conference tournaments in sports that also crown a
104 regular season champion and for sponsoring sports above the
105 minimum of six. Percentages are calculated based on the potential
106 points earned by each institution in the sports it sponsors;

107 • **Mississippi's First Baseball National Champion:**

108 The William Carey baseball team captured Mississippi's first
109 Baseball National Championship when they brought home the title in
110 1969;

111 • **Tennis Sportsmanship Award:**

112 The Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) announced the
113 selection of William Carey University as the winner of the 2024
114 ITA NAIA Women's Team Sportsmanship Award; and
