## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1208: Hunting and fishing on lands of others; revise provisions relating to and provide penalties for.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. Section 49-7-79, Mississippi Code of 1972, is	
8	amended as follows:	
9	49-7-79. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to	
10	knowingly enter the lands of another without the permission of, or	
11	without being accompanied by, the landowner or the lessee of the	
12	land, or the agent of such landowner or lessee, to hunt, fish,	
13	shoot, or trap $\star$ $\star$ $\star$ on the lands or leases of another $\star$ $\star$ $\star$ .	
14	(b) Any person convicted of subsection (a) of this	
15	section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction,	
16	shall be punished for the first offense by a fine of not less than	
17	Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), nor more than One Thousand Dollars	
18	(\$1,000.00). Upon conviction of any person for a second or	
19	subsequent offense, with the offenses being committed within five	
20	(5) years of the last offense, such person shall be punished by a

21 fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), nor more 22 than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). 23 (C) Any person convicted of a second or subsequent 24 offense of subsection (a) of this section, the offenses being 25 committed within a five (5) year period, shall also forfeit all 26 hunting, trapping, and fishing privileges for a period of one (1) 27 year. Such person shall pay a reinstatement fee of Five Hundred 28 Dollars (\$500.00) to have his or her privileges restored. 29 (d) Any animal, bird, fish, or parts thereof, that have 30 been unlawfully taken or possessed in violation of subsection 31 (1) (a) of this section shall be seized by a law enforcement 32 officer and disposed of by the department, or under its direction. 33 (e) In addition to any other fine or penalty, a person 34 convicted of subsection (a) of this section shall be assessed 35 restitution of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), nor 36 more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), for each animal, 37 bird, fish, or parts thereof, taken or possessed in violation of 38 this section. The total amount of restitution authorized by this 39 paragraph shall not exceed an aggregate total of One Thousand Five 40 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) regardless of the number of animals 41 unlawfully taken or possessed in violation of this section. 42 The clerk of the court shall collect and deposit (f) 43 the administrative fees with the State Treasurer, in the same 44 manner and in accordance with the same procedure, as nearly as

45 practicable, as required for the collection and deposit of state 46 assessments under Section 99-19-73.

47 (g) The administrative fee shall be credited to the
48 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, and may be expended
49 by the department upon appropriation by the Legislature.

50 SECTION 2. Section 97-17-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 51 amended as follows:

52 97-17-85. Except as otherwise provided in Sections 73-13-103 53 and 49-7-79, if any person shall go upon the enclosed land of 54 another without his consent, after having been notified by such 55 person or his agent not to do so, either personally or by published or posted notice, or shall remain on such land after a 56 57 request by such person or his agent to depart, he shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for such 58 59 offense. The provisions of this section shall apply to land not 60 enclosed where the stock law is in force.

61 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 62 and after July 1, 2024.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-79, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE LAW PROHIBITING HUNTING ON LANDS OF OTHERS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 97-17-85, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
