REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1471: BEAM; prohibit from accepting gifts or other benefits from any broadband service provider, vendor, or contractor.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 77-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

14 77-19-7. (1) The Office of Broadband Expansion and 15 Accessibility of Mississippi (BEAM) shall serve as the state 16 broadband office to review applications and make determinations 17 and awards for projects to provide broadband access in unserved or 18 underserved areas using the BEAM Fund created pursuant to this 19 chapter.

(2) It shall be the duty and responsibility of BEAM to:
(a) Coordinate all broadband expansion and
accessibility efforts on behalf of the state to ensure an
effective and efficient use of broadband grant funds;

(b) Develop the plan and application for federal grant programs and for sub-grantees to receive funds from said federal grants;

(c) Develop rules and procedures, if necessary and in
accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act, to implement a
competitive statewide broadband grant program;

30 Coordinate all information provided by broadband (d) 31 service providers, including all broadband mapping efforts for the 32 state. All information provided by a broadband service provider 33 pursuant to this chapter shall be presumed to be confidential, 34 proprietary, and subject to exemption from disclosure under state 35 and federal law and shall not be subject to disclosure except in the form of a map where information that could be used to 36 37 determine provider-specific information about the network of the 38 broadband service providers is not disclosed. Such 39 provider-specific information shall not be released to any person 40 without written permission of the submitting broadband service provider. In no instance shall a broadband service provider be 41 42 required to provide any data beyond that which it is required to 43 provide to the Federal Communications Commission pursuant to 47 44 USC Section 641 et seq.; * * *

45 (e) Apply for and receive federal grants or funds,
46 including, but not limited to, Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund
47 established by Section 604 of the Social Security Act, as added by
48 Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, and the
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Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment Program established by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021, and all other federal broadband grant programs and any state support grant programs * * *;and

53 (f) Grant final determinations of awards for projects 54 to provide broadband access in unserved or underserved areas, as provided in subsection (1) of this section, no later than sixty 55 56 (60) days after publishing a preliminary determination of an award 57 on BEAM's website pursuant to this chapter, or thirty (30) days after this law goes into effect, whichever is later, unless BEAM 58 59 determines that a proposed project includes an area where 60 broadband services currently are deployed, or where construction 61 of a network to deploy broadband service is underway by a provider 62 other than the applicant, or where construction is scheduled to be 63 completed within one (1) year after the date of application.

64 (3) To effectuate the purposes of this chapter, any
65 department, division, board, bureau, committee, institution or
66 agency of the state, or any political subdivision thereof, shall,
67 at the request of the Director of BEAM, provide the assistance,
68 information and data needed to enable BEAM to carry out its
69 duties.

(4) <u>An officer or employee of BEAM shall not accept or</u>
<u>receive any gratuity, gift, gift in-kind, money, emolument, or any</u>
<u>other pecuniary benefit, either directly or indirectly, from any</u>
<u>broadband service provider, vendor, contractor, subcontractor,</u>
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74 <u>nonprofit organization or association that does business with or</u> 75 <u>contracts with BEAM, or any designee, employee, agent, officer, or</u> 76 <u>representative of such broadband service provider, vendor,</u> 77 <u>contractor, subcontractor, nonprofit organization or association.</u> 78 <u>For purposes of this section, the term "emolument" includes</u> 79 <u>salary, donations, contributions, loans, stock tips, vacations and</u> 80 trips.

81 (* * *5) There is created within the State Treasury the 82 "Broadband Expansion and Accessibility of Mississippi (BEAM) Fund" 83 for the purposes of the expansion and accessibility of broadband in unserved and underserved areas. The fund shall consist of all 84 85 monies designated, accepted or appropriated by the State of 86 Mississippi for broadband deployment; all monies received from the 87 federal government awarded to or allocated by the state for broadband deployment; and donations, gifts and monies received 88 89 from any other source, including transfers from other funds or 90 accounts. Disbursements from the fund shall be made by the Department of Finance and Administration upon appropriation by the 91 92 Legislature in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. 93 All unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of 94 the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. Monies in the fund 95 shall be invested by the State Treasurer in the same manner as monies in the State General Fund and interest earned on the 96 97 investment of these monies shall be credited to the fund.

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98 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

99 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 PROHIBIT ANY OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE OFFICE OF BROADBAND 3 EXPANSION AND ACCESSIBILITY OF MISSISSIPPI FROM ACCEPTING OR 4 RECEIVING, EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, ANY GRATUITY, GIFT, GIFT 5 IN-KIND, MONEY, EMOLUMENT, OR ANY OTHER PECUNIARY BENEFIT FROM ANY 6 BROADBAND SERVICE PROVIDER, VENDOR, CONTRACTOR, OR SUBCONTRACTOR 7 THAT DOES BUSINESS WITH OR CONTRACTS WITH THE OFFICE; TO PROVIDE 8 CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR FINAL DETERMINATIONS OF AWARDS FOR 9 PROJECTS TO PROVIDE BROADBAND ACCESS IN UNSERVED OR UNDERSERVED AREAS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10
