REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1787: Appropriation; Public Service Commission.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

19 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 20 Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized: 21 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT: 22 51 Permanent: 23 Time-Limited: 6 24 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 25 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 26 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 28 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 30 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 31 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 32 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 33 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 34 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 35 36 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 37 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 38 39 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 40 Mississippi State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 41 42 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 43 employees. 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- 44 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
- 45 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 46 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the
- 47 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 48 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 49 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 51 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 52 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 53 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 54 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 55 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 56 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 57 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 58 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 61 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 62 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 65 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 66 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 67 **SECTION 4.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 68 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

- 122 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 123 Public Service Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
- 124 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 125 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 126 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 127 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 128 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to
- 129 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 130 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 131 during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.
- 132 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 133 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 134 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 135 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 136 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 137 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 138 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 139 made without competitive bids.
- 140 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 141 Public Service Commission shall compile the amount of time that is
- 142 expended on each regulated entity during Fiscal Year 2024. On or
- 143 before August 1, 2024, the Public Service Commission shall report

148 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

149 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon

150 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

151 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

152 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

153 **SECTION 10.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

154 and after July 1, 2024.
