## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1791: Appropriation; Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, Department of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
10	\$ 17,623,369.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
14	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds
15	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
16	support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of
17	Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
18	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
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19	\$ 83,838,244.00.
20	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
21	above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise
22	taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the
23	Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
24	July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025\$ 5,750,000.00.
25	The Department of Revenue is directed to set aside the amount
26	of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit,
27	out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other
28	petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from
29	such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
30	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
31	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
32	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
33	1972.
34	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
35	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
36	authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
37	the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
38	funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
39	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
40	Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
41	amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
42	Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the
43	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
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- 44 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
- 45 defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2025.
- 46 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 47 this act, the following positions are authorized:
- 48 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
- 49 Permanent: 527
- 50 Time-Limited: 53
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 52 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 53 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
- 54 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
- 56 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 57 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 58 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 59 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 60 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024
- 61 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 62 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 63 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 64 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 65 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 66 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 67 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

68	Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
69	publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
70	employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
71	ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
72	not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
73	the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the
74	annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
75	State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
76	essential for the agency.

77 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 78 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 79 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 80 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 81 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 82 83 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 84 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 85 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A

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- 92 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 93 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 94 **SECTION 5.** Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be
- 95 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
- 96 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.
- 97 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of
- 98 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to
- 99 another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on
- 100 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.
- 101 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 102 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain
- 103 complete accounting and personnel records related to the
- 104 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
- 105 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
- 106 maintained for Fiscal Year 2024. It is further the intention of
- 107 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 108 2026 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- 109 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 110 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request
- 111 process.
- 112 **SECTION 7.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 113 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 114 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 115 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 116 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

192	Management Area\$ 50,000.00.
193	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the
194	Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into
195	cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county
196	or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of
197	creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish
198	habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such
199	county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and
200	authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general
201	county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse
202	to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost
203	of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the
204	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto.
205	Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered,
206	in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry
207	out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United
208	States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
209	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
210	such purposes.
211	SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
212	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
213	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
214	Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for

215	any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
216	Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
217	It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
218	authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
219	with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.
220	SECTION 11. In order to be in compliance with Section
221	63-1-201 et seq., funds are herein provided and may be expended by
222	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs
223	of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to
224	reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of
225	their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid
226	Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

- 251 for playground security expenses.
- 252 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred
- 253 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth
- 254 Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in
- 255 the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.
- 256 **SECTION 18.** The fund created pursuant to Section 49-5-21,
- 257 Mississippi Code of 1972, and known as the "Fisheries and Wildlife
- 258 Fund" shall be treated as a special trust fund. All funds derived
- 259 from the sale of licenses, fees, fines and other revenues received
- 260 by the department as provided by law, shall be deposited in the
- 261 Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. In addition, revenue derived from
- 262 the sale of timber on wildlife management areas, refuges and
- 263 preserves shall be deposited into an account established for such
- 264 revenues under the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. The interest and

- 265 any investment income earned on the fund shall be credited by the
- 266 State Treasurer to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund and shall not
- 267 be paid into the General Fund. Any unexpended funds remaining in
- 268 the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse and shall
- 269 remain in the fund. Nothing in this section shall prevent the use
- 270 of said funds from maintenance and upgrade of wildlife management
- 271 areas.
- 272 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 273 more than One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 274 (\$1,300,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the
- 275 purchase of any type of motor vehicle.
- 276 **SECTION 20.** The executive director of the Department of
- 277 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to enter into an
- 278 agreement with any public or private entities to manage any park
- 279 or parks within the state park system.
- 280 **SECTION 21.** It is the intent of the Legislature that no
- 281 state-owned wildlife management area be closed and that to the
- 282 greatest practicable extent, department land management decisions
- 283 and actions may not result in any net loss of any acreage
- 284 available for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006,
- 285 as provided in Section 49-5-99(4). It is the intention of the
- 286 Legislature that no state park be closed without legislative
- 287 approval.
- 288 **SECTION 22.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 289 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have

- the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose of placing a sign on such state park property under the department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall
- remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper special fund.
- section 23. It is the intent of the Legislature that from
  the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
  Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property
  damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real
  property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other
  assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a
  granting entity.
- SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
  (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying
  the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds
  shall be used for "Personal Services."
- 308 SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
  309 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
  310 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
  311 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars
  312 (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection,
  313 conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this
  314 state.

315	SECTION 26. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
316	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
317	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
318	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
319	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
320	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
321	actions contrary to this provision.
322	SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
323	the intention of the Legislature that Fifty-eight Thousand Five
324	Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$58,593.00) may be allocated for the
325	Hunter Education program supported from the General Fund court
326	assessments.
327	SECTION 28. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
328	of Section 2, Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), or so much
329	thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in
330	the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as
331	created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and
332	allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office as
333	follows:
334	a) Projects on the Park Improvement Plan\$ 8,350,000.00
335	b) Museum Admissions Area Renovation
336	Phase II\$ 1,500,000.00
337	c) Road Improvements at J.P. Coleman

342	SECTION 29. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
343	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
344	Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of
345	Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks the purpose of reauthorizing the
346	expenditure of Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in HB 1617,
347	2023 Regular Session. The purpose of these funds is to assist the
348	Department with improving and developing the area in the LeFleur's
349	Bluff Education and Tourism Complex and in coordination with the
350	Mississippi Children's Museum, and the Department of Finance and
351	Administration in order to promote tourism, education, and
352	recreational activity that contributes to community well-being for
353	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.
354	\$ 13,000,000.00
355	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
356	the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
357	section, shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
358	remaining as of June 30, 2024, from the amount authorized for the
359	previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not
360	change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized
361	SECTION 30. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
362	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
363	Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of
364	Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks for the purpose of reauthorizing
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Any remaining funds in this section may be used to continue

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365	the expenditure of Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in HB
366	1617, 2023 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing equipment
367	for the agency for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and
368	ending June 30, 2025\$ 1,100,000.00
369	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
370	the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
371	section, shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
372	remaining as of June 30, 2024, from the amount authorized for the
373	previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not
374	change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized
375	SECTION 31. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Eight
376	Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$8,100,000.00) may be
377	provided from the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund.
378	These funds are available for completing projects awarded to the
379	Department by the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Outdoor
380	Stewardship Trust Fund.
381	SECTION 32. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
382	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
383	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
384	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
385	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
386	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
387	SECTION 33. This act shall take effect and be in force from
388	and after July 1, 2024.
