REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1799: Appropriation; Insurance, Department of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

| 5 | SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be |
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| 6 | necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General |
| 7 | Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the |
| 8 | expenses of the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the fiscal |
| 9 | year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025 |
| 10 | \$ 13,913,556.00. |
| 11 | SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be |
| 12 | necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in |
| 13 | the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of |
| 14 | Insurance which is comprised of special source funds collected by |
| 15 | or otherwise available to the department, for the support of the |
| 16 | various offices of the department for the fiscal year beginning |
| 17 | July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025\$ 8,155,000.00. |

18 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

19 this act, the following positions are authorized:

- 20 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
- 21 Permanent: 131
- 22 Time-Limited: 0
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 24 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 25 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
- 26 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 27 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
- 28 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 29 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 30 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 31 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 32 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024
- 33 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 34 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 35 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 36 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 37 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 38 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 39 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 40 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 41 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 42 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to

- 43 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
- 44 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 45 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the
- 46 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 47 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 48 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 50 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 51 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 52 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 53 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 54 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 55 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 56 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 57 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 59 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 60 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 61 withdrawn and no longer available.
- 62 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 63 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 64 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 65 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 66 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 67 Mississippi Department of Insurance shall maintain complete

| 68 | accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all |
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| 69 | funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be |
| 70 | in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal |
| 71 | Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that |
| 72 | the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be |
| 73 | submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format |
| 74 | and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail |
| 75 | provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process. |
| 76 | SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance |
| 77 | Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of |
| 78 | the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized |
| 79 | in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the |
| 80 | intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, |
| 81 | this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted |
| 82 | performance measures provided below: |

| 111 | SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the p | rovisions of |
| 112 | Section 1, funds in the amount of Twenty Thousand Doll | ars |
| 113 | (\$20,000.00) is provided and shall be expended to pay | the annual |
| 114 | dues for the National Conference of Insurance Legislat | ors. |
| 115 | SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislatur | e that none |
| 116 | of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unle | ss members |
| 117 | of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Missis | sippi Senate |
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- 118 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony
- 119 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public
- 120 announcement or ceremony regarding any project for which the
- 121 Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any
- 122 public event or project shall include the following language:
- 123 "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi
- 124 State Legislature."
- 125 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 126 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 127 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 128 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 129 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 130 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 131 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 132 made without competitive bids.
- 133 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Five
- 134 Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), or so much thereof as may be
- 135 necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury
- 136 to the credit of the Mississippi Comprehensive Hurricane
- 137 Mitigation Program Trust Fund, as created in House Bill 1705,
- 138 Regular Session of 2024, and allocated in a manner as determined
- 139 by the Treasurer's Office to the Department of Insurance. The
- 140 Department of Insurance shall utilize these funds for the purpose
- 141 of administering the Comprehensive Hurricane Damage Mitigation
- 142 Program created in Section 83-1-191, Mississippi Code of 1972. As

- 143 a condition of expending the funds provided in this section, the
- 144 Department shall limit the amount of grants provided to any
- 145 individual as provided in House Bill 1705, Regular Session of
- 146 2024.
- 147 **SECTION 11.** Within the limits of the funds available to the
- 148 Mississippi Insurance Department for such purpose, the
- 149 Commissioner of Insurance for the Mississippi Insurance Department
- 150 may grant a paid internship to students pursuing junior or senior
- 151 undergraduate level year coursework toward a bachelor's degree in
- 152 risk management insurance or graduate level coursework towards a
- 153 master's degree in business administration. Those applicants
- deemed qualified by the Mississippi Department of Insurance shall
- 155 receive funds that may be used to pay for tuition, books and
- 156 related fees to pursue their degree. It is the intent of the
- 157 Legislature that the paid internship program shall be used as
- 158 incentive for risk management insurance careers at the Mississippi
- 159 Insurance Department.
- SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two
- 161 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the
- 162 State Fire Marshal's Office for fire safety prevention and
- 163 services, including, but not limited to, fire protection supplies
- 164 and materials, smoke alarms, and public service announcements
- 165 providing fire prevention information.
- 166 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 167 of Section 2, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be

- 168 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
- 169 to the credit of the Propane Education and Research Program Fund,
- 170 for the purpose of research and development of more cost effective
- 171 uses of propane and on educational programs, safety programs, and
- 172 market development of propane for the fiscal year beginning
- 173 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 130,000.00.
- 174 **SECTION 14.** Of the funds provided in Section 2, Three
- 175 Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) is provided from the Mississippi
- 176 Volunteer Firefighter Length-of-Service Awards Program Fund.
- 177 These funds are provided for the Mississippi Length-of-Service
- 178 Award Program (LOSAP) established in Section 45-11-271 of the
- 179 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 180 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2,
- 181 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), or so much thereof as
- 182 may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State
- 183 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in
- 184 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a
- 185 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are
- 186 provided for the purchase of smoke alarms.
- 187 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One
- 188 Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$120,500.00), or so
- 189 much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purchase of
- 190 vehicles.
- 191 **SECTION 17.** In addition to all other sums heretofore
- 192 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be

| 193 | necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special |
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| 194 | fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Annual Fire Fund |
| 195 | to the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the purposes |
| 196 | allowed in Section 17-23-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the |
| 197 | fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025 |
| 198 | \$ 9,000,000.00. |
| 199 | SECTION 18. In addition to all other funds appropriated, the |
| 200 | following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby |
| 201 | appropriated out of any money in the special fund in the State |
| 202 | Treasury to the credit of the Rural Fire Truck Matching Assistance |
| 203 | Fund which was created in Section 17-23-1 (4), Mississippi Code of |
| 204 | 1972 to the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the Rural Fire |
| 205 | Truck Matching Assistance Program for the fiscal year beginning |
| 206 | July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025\$ 2,000,000.00. |
| 207 | SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by |
| 208 | the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the |
| 209 | credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon |
| 210 | warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal |
| 211 | Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the |
| 212 | proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. |
| 213 | SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from |
| 214 | and after July 1, 2024. |
