REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1800: Appropriation; Medicaid, Division of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
9	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
10	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
11	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
12	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
13	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
14	beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025

16	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
17	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
18	to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
19	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

20 medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the 21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025..... 22\$ 940,637,381.00. 23 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 24 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in 25 the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source 26 27 funds collected by or otherwise available to the Division, for the 28 purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi 29 Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of 30 such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 6,451,388,505.00. 31 32 Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any 33 recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to 34 35 offset the cost of such audits and third party recoveries and as 36 such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for

37 these purposes.

44 The above funds shall be allocated as follows:

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52 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 53 this act, the following positions are authorized:

55 Permanent: 927 56 Time-Limited: 82

57 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 58 59 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 60 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 61 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 62 63 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 64 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 65 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 66 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. 70 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 71 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 72 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 73 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

74 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 75 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 76 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 77 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 78 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 79 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the 80 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 81 82 essential for the agency.

83 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 84 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 85 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 86 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 87 The 88 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 89 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 90 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 91 appropriated level.

92 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 93 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 94 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 95 withdrawn and no longer available.

96 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 97 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A 98 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 99 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

100 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 101 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete 102 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 103 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 104 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 105 Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 106 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be 107 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 108 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 109 provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process with 110 the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) being separated from the Medical Services Program and submitted as a separate 111 112 program. All Medicaid 1915 (C) Home and Community Based Services 113 Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the 114 Medical Services Program. In addition, the performance measures 115 reported for the Medical Services Program shall include an 116 unduplicated case count of individuals served by eligibility 117 status, and the number and the costs of emergency room visits.

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118 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 119 120 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 121 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 122 intended mission of this agency. 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A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2026.

196 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that 197 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 198 199 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 200 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 201 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 202 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 203 made without competitive bids.

204 SECTION 9. The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid 205 shall provide statistical and financial reports on a monthly basis 206 to the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. These 207 reports shall include, but are not limited to, an accounting of 208 all funds spent in the medical program, the CHIP program, the 209 Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home and 210 Community Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds 211 spent in the administrative program, participant statistics and 212 any other information requested by the Legislative Budget Office 213 and the PEER Committee.

The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and any other information requested available, upon 24/HR13/HB1800CR.1J *HR13/OHB1800CR.1J* (H)A2;AP (S)AP

A summary of this cash flow projection shall also 222 be presented in the report referenced in the above paragraph.

223 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 224 of this act in an amount not to exceed, Two Million Seven Hundred 225 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00) is provided for the purpose 226 of funding a temporary program to provide nonemergency 227 transportation to locations for necessary dialysis services for 228 end-stage renal disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of 229 age or older or are disabled as determined under Section 230 1614(a)(3) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, whose 231 income did not exceed one hundred thirty-five percent (135%) of 232 the nonfarm official poverty level as defined by the Office of 233 Management and Budget and whose eligibility was covered under the 234 former category of eligibility known as Poverty Level Aged and 235 Disabled (PLADS).

236 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 237 Section 3 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that 238 Two Million Six Hundred Forty Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-one 239 Dollars (\$2,640,491.00) of which Six Hundred Two Thousand Two 240 Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$602,260.00) is in General Funds and Two Million Thirty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-one Dollars 241 *HR13/OHB1800CR.1J* 24/HR13/HB1800CR.1J (H)A2;AP (S)AP PAGE 10 A1/2 (LP/DW)

(\$2,038,231.00) is in Special Funds provided for the purpose of funding Presumptively Eligible Pregnant Women as passed in HB 539, Regular Session 2024.

245 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 246 funds appropriated in this act to the Governor's Office - Division 247 of Medicaid for the Mississippi Coordinated Access Network 248 (MS-CAN) program be used in the most efficient and effective 249 manner possible to achieve the intended mission of the division. 250 The division and the coordinated care organizations with which the 251 division has contracted to conduct the MS-CAN program shall 252 establish baselines for the health-related outcome measurement for 253 each of the following health focus areas for presentation at the 254 Joint Legislative Budget Committee hearings for Fiscal Year 2025, 255 which will be used as the baseline levels for establishing targets 256 for improvements in quality of care performance measures for the 257 MS-CAN program in Fiscal Year 2025 and later fiscal years:

a. Comprehensive Diabetes Care (CDC) or successive measure.
b. Medication Management for People with Asthma (MMA) or
successive measure.

261 c. Annual Monitoring for Patients on Persistent Medications262 (MPM) or successive measure.

263 d. Adult BMI Assessment (ABA) and Weight Assessment and
 264 Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for

265 Children/Adolescents (WCC) or successive measure.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid and the Department of Human Services shall continue to work together to implement Section 43-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, known as the "Medicaid and Human Services Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".

275 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1, 2, and 276 3 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that 277 continued funding at or above the Fiscal Year 2024 appropriated 278 amount shall be provided for forty-one hundred (4,100) slots for 279 the Department of Rehabilitation Services Home and Community Based 280 Waiver programs, and for two thousand nine hundred fifty (2,950) 281 slots for the Department of Mental Health for the Home and 282 Community Based waiver program for Independent Living and the IDD 283 Waiver program.

284 SECTION 15. The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid is 285 authorized to expend funds appropriated herein as necessary to 286 provide currently existing home and community based services 287 through any CMS approved state plan or home and community based 288 services waiver to individuals who qualify for those services to 289 avoid institutionalization or to transition an individual from an 290 institution to any home and community based setting. 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291 such services shall not count against any limit imposed under this 292 act. It is the intention of the Legislature that the cost of providing home and community based services shall not exceed the 293 294 cost of nursing facility services, as determined by the Division. 295 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated herein, no more than 296 Five Hundred Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-two Dollars 297 (\$503,522.00) may be used to pay invoices to certain vendors for expenses incurred in FY 2020 and 2022. 298

299 **SECTION 17.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 300 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 301 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 302 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 303 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 304 305 SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from 306 and after July 1, 2024.
