## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2180: Department of Public Safety; remove prior written approval for certain events and authorize enforcement of municipal code.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

16 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the 17 18 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the 19 properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets, 20 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court 21 22 Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building 23 and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any 24 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State 25 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically 26 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but

(S)JB (H)JA G1/2 27 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would 28 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall, 29 through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi 30 31 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of 32 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this 33 section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and 34 35 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties 36 related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95 shall remain 37 with the Department of Finance and Administration. 38

39 Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of (2)State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and 40 41 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into 42 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the 43 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees 44 45 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the 46 City of Jackson.

47 (3)The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the 48 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all 49 50 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new 51 24/SS26/SB2180CR.4J (S)JB (H)JA PAGE 2 G1/2

52 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and 53 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County, 54 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 55 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel 56 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and 57 responses to security system alarms.

58 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of (4)59 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the 60 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all 61 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department 62 of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property. 63 64 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture 65 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of 66 Public Safety to supply the security personnel to the Department 67 of Agriculture with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State 68 of Mississippi on this property and any and all buildings on this 69 property. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to charge 70 the Department of Agriculture a fee for security services provided 71 for special events at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex. 72 The fee charged will be commensurate with the cost associated with 73 the Department of Public Safety providing those services.

74 (5) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
75 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department
76 of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with

80 (6)(a) The Department of Public Safety shall have primary 81 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law 82 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi 83 within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary 84 85 function. The Department of Public Safety may, through any person 86 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make 87 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi \* \* \*. The Department of Public Safety may also make 88 89 arrests for any violations of the City of Jackson's \* \* \* 90 ordinances \* \* \* which \* \* \* occur within the boundaries of the district and within the boundaries of the City of Jackson. 91 The 92 Department of Public Safety may choose to present cases to either 93 the District Attorney or the prosecuting attorneys designated by the Attorney General for prosecution of any violation of law that 94 95 accrues or occurs, in whole or in part, within the boundaries 96 established by Section 29-5-203. The jurisdiction of the 97 Department of Public Safety granted under this subsection (6) 98 shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, 99 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi within the 100 boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any time and/or during any event 101

102 necessitating the coordination of and/or utilization at multiple 103 jurisdictions, as determined by the Chief of Capitol Police or the 104 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety shall be the lead 105 agency when the event occurs on property as defined herein that is 106 owned or leased by the state as provided in subsection (1) of this 107 section. The jurisdiction and authority of the Department of 108 Public Safety under this subsection (6) shall be in addition to 109 any other jurisdiction and authority provided to the department 110 under this section or any other law.

111 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall have jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State 112 113 of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson, 114 Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, 115 116 make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of 117 Mississippi which occurs within the boundaries of the City of 118 The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety Jackson. granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be 119 120 concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, 121 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.

141 SECTION 2. Section 9-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 142 amended as follows:

143 9-12-1. (1) (a) From and after January 1, 2024, there shall be created one (1) inferior court as authorized by Article 144 145 6, Section 172 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to be 146 located within the boundaries established in Section 29-5-203 for 147 the Capitol Complex Improvement District, hereinafter referred to 148 as "CCID". The CCID inferior court shall have jurisdiction to 149 hear and determine all preliminary matters and criminal matters 150 authorized by law for municipal courts that accrue or occur, in whole or in part, within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex 151 24/SS26/SB2180CR.4J
