## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3010: Appropriation; IHL - Mississippi State University - Cooperative Extension Service.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 8 maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for 9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending 10 June 30, 2025.....\$ 33,536,601.00. 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 13 source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available

14 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi 15 Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning

16 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 14,444,984.00.

SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of thisact, One Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars

24/SS15/SB3010CR.J (S)AP (H)A4;AP PAGE 1 A1/2 19 (\$1,150,000.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement 20 Fund from funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 21 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

22 SECTION 4. No general funds authorized to be expended herein 23 shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds 24 which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions 25 of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the emphasis areas of Agriculture, Family and Consumer Education, Natural Resources and Environment, 4-H, and Business and Community Development in each county.

31 SECTION 6. No part of the funds appropriated or authorized 32 to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for 33 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who 34 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service 35 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of 36 State Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such 37 legal services.

38 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 39 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to 40 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 41 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 42 during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.

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43 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that if the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly 44 or indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants, 45 research grants or donations, such special source funds not 46 47 classified as current restricted funds shall be added and 48 accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special 49 50 source funds be included in all reports and requests for the 2025 51 Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature.

52 SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 53 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 54 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 55 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 56 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 57 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 58 performance measures provided below:

86	SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that
87	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
88	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
89	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
90	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind

91 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

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92 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 93 made without competitive bids.

94 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 95 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 96 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 97 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 98 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 99 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 100 actions contrary to this provision.

101 **SECTION 12.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 102 of Section 2, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), or so 103 much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State 104 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in 105 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are 106 107 provided for the purpose of assisting with costs associated with 108 administering the Mississippi Youth Preparedness Initiative.

SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2024.

inserting in lieu thereof the following:
