REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3017: Appropriation; Employment Security, Department of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 7 Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the 8 expenses of the Mississippi Department of Employment Security for 9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending 10 June 30, 2025......\$ 1,800,000.00.

SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of Employment Security, or its successor, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by said department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025......\$ 136,805,708.00.

17 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 18 this act, the following positions are authorized:

22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 23 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 24 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 28 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 29 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 30 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 31 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 32 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that 33 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 34 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 35 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 36 37 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 38 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If

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44 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the 45 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 46 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 47 essential for the agency.

48 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 49 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 50 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 51 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 52 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 53 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 54 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 55 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 56 appropriated level.

57 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 58 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 59 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 60 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

65 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 66 Section 2 of this act, the following sum shall be derived from 67 money in the Unemployment Trust Fund, made available to this state 68 under Section 903 of the Social Security Act, as amended (42 USCA

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70 Security to be deposited in the Employment Security Administration 71 Fund and used by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security 72 for the following purposes:

97 (b) Administration of the Unemployment Compensation 98 (UC) law and its public employment service (ES) offices. This 99 includes, but is not limited to, the following uses:

(i) ES and UI automation. This includes
purchases, modifications, or automation of computer-related
systems and related costs.

(v) Under the direction of the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management to acquire lands and construct buildings thereon or improve existing buildings to be used as offices. The funds in this section are authorized for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025..... 33,047,000.00.

113 The funds authorized in this section shall be requisitioned 114 by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security from the 115 Unemployment Trust Fund maintained by the Secretary of the 116 Treasury of the United States as needed for the payment of 117 obligations incurred under this appropriation, and such monies

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121 It is the intention of the Legislature that SECTION 5. 122 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 123 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 124 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 125 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 126 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 127 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 128 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) is provided to the Mississippi Department of Employment Security for the purpose

144 SECTION 9. In addition to all other funds appropriated 145 herein, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, 146 is appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund, not 147 otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses 148 of the Office of Workforce Development for the fiscal year 149 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025...... 150\$ 20,986,205.00.

SECTION 10. In addition to all other funds appropriated herein, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available to the Office of Workforce Development for support of workforce programs, grants, and other similar activities for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025......\$ 19,400,000.00.

158 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 9, Three 159 Million Eight Hundred Eighty-six Thousand Two Hundred Five Dollars 160 (\$3,886,205.00) is authorized for defraying the operating expenses 161 of the Office of Workforce Development.

162 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 9, Fifteen 163 Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) is authorized for operating the 164 Career Coaching Program at the Office of Workforce Development.

165 **SECTION 13.** Unless otherwise specifically appropriated for 166 that purpose by the Legislature, none of the funds authorized in

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 10 of this act, the Office of Workforce Development is authorized to expend up to Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the State Workforce Investment Funds from the State Workforce Investment Board, collected pursuant to Section 71-5-353, Mississippi Code of 175 1972.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 10 of this act, the Office of Workforce Development is authorized to expend up to Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) from the Mississippi Works Fund collected pursuant to Section 71-5-353, Mississippi Code of 1972.

181 SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 182 Mississippi Department of Employment Security and the Office of 183 Workforce Development shall maintain complete accounting and 184 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 185 186 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 187 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that each 188 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to 189 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 190 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process. 191

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(S)AP (H)A4;AP A1/2 SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 9 of this act, Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) is authorized for Jobs for America's Graduates-Mississippi.

SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 10 of this act, Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided to the Skills Foundation of Mississippi.

SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Section 9 of this act, One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) is provided to the Office of Workforce Development for a new Information Management and Financial Tracking System to enhance the tracking of funding provided for workforce development and provide data outcomes reports on active workforce training programs and participants.

SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated in Section 10, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Senate Bill 2001, 1st Extraordinary Session of 2024, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided to expedite the services needed for Project Poppy.

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217 SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 11 of this 218 act, funds are provided to the Office of Workforce Development to 219 coordinate workforce development programs at the Mississippi 220 Department of Corrections.

SECTION 22. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

228 SECTION 23. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 229 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 230 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 231 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 232 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 233 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 234 SECTION 24.
