REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3021: Appropriation; Mental Health, Department of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 39 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 40 Sections 1 and 2 of this act, the following positions are
- 41 authorized:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 45 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 46 47 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 48 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 49 50 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 51 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 52 53 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 54 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 55 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that 56 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 57 58 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 59 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 60

Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the

Mississippi State Personnel Board.

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- 68 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 69 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 70 essential for the agency.
- 71 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 72 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or

- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 85 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 86 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 87 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 88 **SECTION 5.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 89 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 90 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 91 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 92 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

193	SECTION 6. The Department of Mental Health and its
194	facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending
195	authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to
196	transfer funds to the Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid
197	match and designate that the funds thus transferred shall be
198	applied to Medicaid match obligations arising in the subsequent
199	fiscal year.
200	SECTION 7. Any person within the Department of Mental Healt
201	who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by

- h 201 who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by 202 the Governor may, at the discretion of the Director of the 203 Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of Mental 204 Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call-back 205 pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."
- 206 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the "Service 207 Budget," funds are included for the support of community mental 208 health services for Fiscal Year 2025.
- 209 Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for the support of community mental health services shall be made 210 211 available to any Regional Mental Health/Intellectual Disability 212 Center which does not receive from each of its participating 213 counties a dollar amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a 214 three-fourths (3/4) mill tax on all taxable property in the county 215 in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds 216 contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984,

- 218 the Department of Mental Health shall disburse the funds 219 appropriated in this section for services for the mentally ill, 220 intellectually disabled and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board 221 of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be 222 responsible for selecting the types of services which shall be 223 provided with the funds appropriated in this section, for developing and monitoring performance contracts and for holding 224 225 contractors accountable for utilization of funds.
- SECTION 9. Ellisville State School is authorized to draw up
 to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) from interest
 earned on funds invested in Ellisville State School Client's Trust
 Fund for the purpose of supplementing the cost related to
 supplies, property, and equipment in direct care.
 - SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health and its facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated by the department, either directly or by means of transferring funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, and to transfer such funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds, and Real Property Management for the purposes of constructing and equipping group homes for persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; constructing and equipping such other buildings as may be required for treatment of persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or

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- substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; and to construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) constructed with funds authorized in this section shall be authorized to participate in Medicaid funding available for such services.
- 249 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 250 Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and 251 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 252 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 253 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 254 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 255 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to 256 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 257 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 258 during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.
- 259 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 260 of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 261 utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such 262 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 263 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 264 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 265 with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall 266 include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not

include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities shall be prohibited.

269 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 270 Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have 271 authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to 272 another special fund treasury fund under the control of the 273 Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to 274 more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 275 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the 276 Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for 277 the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department 278 of Finance and Administration. None of the funds transferred with 279 this section may be transferred to the Central Office for Personal 280 Services.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, Twenty-nine Million Eight Hundred Ninety-seven Thousand One Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars (\$29,897,169.00) is provided to the Department of Mental Health to expand those community-based services that will improve the State of Mississippi's compliance with the Olmstead decision of the United States Supreme Court. Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to transfer such sums from this source as are necessary to implement or improve those community services that are more appropriately addressed by the Mississippi Department of Education

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292 and/or the Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services to 293 those agencies for that purpose. Further, it is the intention of 294 the Legislature that any sums received from this source that are 295 not expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by the 296 Mississippi Department of Mental Health shall be reappropriated 297 for the same purpose during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. 298 Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the 299 Department of Mental Health shall account for the expenditure of 300 these funds in sufficient detail to clearly show the purposes for 301 which such funds were expended. The Executive Director of the 302 Department of Mental Health shall report any such reappropriation 303 to the Legislative Budget Office no later than fifteen (15) days 304 after the effective date of the reappropriation.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
Department of Mental Health, with approval by the board, may
contract with Community Mental Health Centers, or suitable
entities, for the purpose of operating the Crisis Intervention
Centers at Grenada, Batesville, Brookhaven, Cleveland, Corinth,
Laurel and Newton. The department shall provide quarterly
progress reports on the operation of the crisis intervention
centers to the Chairmen of the Senate and House Public Health and
Appropriations Committees.

SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

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317	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
318	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
319	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
320	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
321	made without competitive bids.
322	SECTION 17. The Department of Finance and Administration

323 (DFA) shall transfer funds back to the Department of Mental 324 Health, upon the request of the Department of Mental Health, where 325 the funds received by DFA from the Department of Mental Health 326 were special funds (neither general funds or bond funds) and where 327 those funds are not required for the payment of costs already 328 incurred on a building or repair project. For the purposes of 329 this section, the term "special funds" includes any state source 330 special funds, including, but not limited to, funds from the 331 Health Care Expendable Fund. The duty of DFA to transfer funds 332 back to the Department of Mental Health under this section applies 333 to any funds described in this section that were transferred to 334 DFA, regardless of the year that the transfer was made by the 335 Department of Mental Health.

336 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 337 Department of Mental Health may provide, upon the availability of funds, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) to the Hope 339 Village for Children Program.

- 340 SECTION 19. None of the funds provided in Section 1, 2, or 3
- 341 of this act shall be used to pay Medicaid match for the eleven
- 342 (11) Community Mental Health Centers.
- 343 SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 344 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Three Million
- 345 Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Two Dollars
- 346 (\$3,910,702.00) shall be allocated to the Crisis Intervention
- 347 Mental Health Fund supported by General Fund court assessments.
- 348 SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
- 349 Department of Mental Health shall fund ten (10) Programs of
- 350 Assertive Community Treatment (PACT) Teams and provide supportive
- employment for individuals with intellectual and developmental 351
- 352 disabilities.
- 353 Notwithstanding any other provision, the SECTION 22.
- 354 Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to escalate
- 355 its headcount for any additional operational needs related to
- 356 Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds upon approval of the
- 357 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Personnel
- 358 Board.
- 359 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
- 360 the intention of the Legislature that One Million Three Hundred
- 361 Ninety-two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-four Dollars
- 362 (\$1,392,944.00) is provided as an increase over and above the
- 363 Fiscal Year 2024 appropriation level of funding for One Hundred
- 364 (100) ID/DD Home and Community Based Waiver slots for an estimated

365 total of Three Thousand (3,000) slots in the ID/DD Home and 366 Community Based Waiver program.

SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
act, Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), or so much
thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury
to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section
27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as
determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided
for the purpose of naloxone grants.

374 **SECTION 25.** With the funds appropriated herein, the
375 Department of Mental Health is authorized to make payment for
376 expenses incurred during Fiscal Year 2021 and 2022 as follows:

SECTION 26. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

387 **SECTION 27.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 388 and after July 1, 2024.
