## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3022: Appropriation; Transportation, Department of -State Aid Road Construction, Office of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
7	to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,
8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State
9	Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of
10	Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and
11	ending June 30, 2025\$ 220,345,746.00.
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
13	this act, the following positions are authorized:

16 17	Time-Limited: 0 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's

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Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 19 20 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 21 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 23 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 24 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 25 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 26 27 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 28 29 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 30 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 31 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 32 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 33 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

34 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 35 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 36 37 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 38 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. Ιf 39 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the 40 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 41 42 essential for the agency.

43 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 44 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 45 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 46 47 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 48 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 49 50 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 51 appropriated level.

52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 54 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 55 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

60 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 61 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to 62 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized 63 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi 64 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for 65 66 administering and providing engineering services to political 67 subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code 24/SS15/SB3022CR.J (S)AP (H)A4;AP

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of 1972. Any such funds shall be deposited into the Office of
State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.

SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Forty Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) is authorized to be expended for the purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on the Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).

76 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 77 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete 78 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 79 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 80 81 Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 82 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be 83 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 84 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process. 85

86 SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 87 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 88 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 89 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 90 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 91 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

141	SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this act, the	
142	Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the	Э
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24/SS15/SB3022CR.J (S)AP (H)A4;AP PAGE 6 A1/2 143 Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of 144 projects within their respective districts and at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant 145 in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding 146 the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for 147 148 which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge 149 150 shall include the following language: "Funds were made available 151 for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The 152 signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in 153 which the project was funded.

154 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature to 155 authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the 156 Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein appropriated or made available by the counties or any other 157 158 source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National 159 Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway 160 Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or 161 special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State 162 Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore 163 been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17, 164 Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office 165 of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these 166 funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of

167 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 168 consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

169 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that in 170 the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road 171 Construction administers and provides engineering services to 172 political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act, 173 bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising 174 for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or 175 having a circulation in the county or municipality where the contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid 176 177 opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the 178 advertisement is published.

179 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that 180 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 181 182 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 183 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 184 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 185 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 186 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 24/SS15/SB3022CR.J

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AP (H)A4;AP A1/2 192 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 193 actions contrary to this provision.

194 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Fifty 195 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or so much thereof as may be 196 necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury 197 to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Senate Bill 198 2001, 1st Extraordinary Session of 2024, and allocated in a manner 199 as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided 200 for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.

201 **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 202 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 203 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 204 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 205 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 206 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 207 208 and after July 1, 2024.
