HOUSE BILL NO. 715

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE DOWNTOWN JACKSON REVITALIZATION 2 COALITION FOR THE PURPOSE OF BRINGING FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL 3 STAKEHOLDERS TOGETHER TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN LEADING TO 4 THE REVITALIZATION OF DOWNTOWN JACKSON; TO DESIGNATE MEMBERS OF 5 THE COALITION; TO REQUIRE THE COALITION TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE 6 GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE OF ITS ACTIVITIES AND RECOMMENDATIONS 7 BEFORE JANUARY 10, 2026; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established the Downtown Jackson 10 Revitalization Coalition for the purpose of bringing together 11 stakeholders on the national, state and local levels for the development of a comprehensive plan leading to the revitalization 12 13 of downtown Jackson, the capital city of the State of Mississippi. 14 The coalition is composed of the following twenty-one (2) 15 (21) members or their respective designees: 16 The United States Department of Agriculture State (a) 17 Director for Mississippi; 18 (b) The Interim Third Party Manager appointed by the United States District Court for the Southern District of 19 20 Mississippi to oversee the city's water and sewer systems; G1/2 H. 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46 (u) The Chief of the Jackson Police Department.
47 A member of the coalition named in this subsection may
48 designate an individual from the staff of the member's office,
49 agency or organization to serve in place of that member on the
50 coalition.

The Lieutenant Governor shall set the date and location 51 (3) for an organizational meeting of the coalition, which must be held 52 53 before September 1, 2025. Notice of the organizational meeting 54 and subsequent meetings must be provided no less than three (3) 55 weeks before the date on which the meeting is scheduled. At the 56 organizational meeting, the coalition shall determine those 57 officers deemed necessary for the coalition's functioning and 58 shall elect from among the membership persons to serve as the 59 officers. Meetings of the coalition must be held on a monthly basis. The coalition shall establish its goals and objectives for 60 61 each meeting, which may include informational sessions by 62 interested stakeholders and tours to various sites pertinent to the work of the coalition within the City of Jackson. All actions 63 64 of the coalition must be decided by a majority vote of the members 65 of the coalition present and voting at the meeting at which an 66 action is being considered.

67 (4) Members of the coalition will serve without
68 compensation. However, those members of the coalition employed by
69 a state or local government agency may be reimbursed for mileage

72 (5) The coalition may accept gifts, donations and grants of 73 any kind from any source, public or private, to help defray any 74 expenses incurred by the coalition.

(6) Whenever feasible, members of the coalition shall make available such professional and administrative staff as may be necessary to assist the coalition in the performance of its duties.

(7) Before January 10, 2026, the coalition shall submit a report of its determinations and recommended actions to the Governor and the Legislature. The report must include, but need not be limited to, the following:

(a) An inventory of existing resources that are aimed
at making improvements in the City of Jackson and how those
resources may be utilized and supported in furtherance of their
goals;

(b) A description of the activities of the coalition;
(c) Recommendations for a cohesive plan of action to
bring community stakeholders together to implement measures aimed
at revitalizing downtown Jackson and spurring economic
development, reducing crime and making improvements to the city's
infrastructure; and

96 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 97 and after July 1, 2025.

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
