JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 201

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION TO AMEND CHAPTER 2150, LAWS OF 2022, TO
2 REVISE THE COMPOSITION OF MISSISSIPPI STATE SENATE DISTRICTS 1, 2,
3 3, 10, 11, 12, 19, 34, 41, 42, 44 AND 45; AND FOR RELATED
4 PURPOSES.

5 WHEREAS, in its July 2, 2024, opinion, the United States
6 District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi, in the
7 case styled Mississippi State Conf. of the NAACP v. State Bd. of
8 Election Comm'rs., No. 3:22-CV-734, concluded that the Plaintiffs
9 had shown violations of Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act.
10 Specifically, the Court found the Plaintiffs had shown that two
11 (2) Senate districts did not satisfy the framework of Thornburg v.
12 Gingles, 478 U.S. 30 (1986); and

13 WHEREAS, to remedy those violations, the Court recognized
14 that redistricting is primarily the duty and responsibility of the
15 State through its Legislature or other body, rather than a federal
16 court, and further stated that the Mississippi Legislature would
17 be given an opportunity to create new districts, and ultimately
18 elections would be needed in all reformed districts; and



19 WHEREAS, on July 18, 2024, after considering options, the
20 Court gave the Mississippi Legislature until the conclusion of the
21 2025 Regular Session to develop a remedial plan; and

22 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature has reviewed the orders
23 of the Court in the above-styled case and has prepared amendments
24 to the Mississippi State Senate Redistricting plan adopted in
25 2022, thereby creating two (2) new State Senate Districts wherein
26 minorities will have an opportunity to elect a candidate of their
27 choice while limiting the ripple effect to existing districts as
28 much as reasonably possible:

29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
30 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, that Chapter 2150, Laws of 2022, is amended
31 as follows:

32 "BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
33 MISSISSIPPI, That the Senate shall consist of fifty-two (52)
34 Senators who shall be elected from fifty-two (52) single-member
35 districts, composed as follows:

531 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the boundaries of the senatorial

536 boundaries as the precinct boundaries are contained in Census

541 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That:

542 (1) This joint resolution shall be liberally construed to
543 effectuate the purposes thereof and to redistrict the Senate
544 districts of this state in compliance with constitutional
545 requirements. It is the intent of the Legislature that this joint
546 resolution, and the districts described herein, completely
547 encompass all the area within the state. It is also intended that
548 such districts contain all the inhabitants in this state. It is
549 further intended that the redistricting provided for in this joint
550 resolution results in the creation of districts that are as close
551 to equal in population as permissible under law. It is also
552 intended that no district shall contain any of the area included
553 within the description of another district.

554 (2) If the districts described in this joint resolution do
555 not carry out the purposes thereof because of unintentional
556 omissions, duplications, overlapping areas, erroneous
557 nomenclature, lack of adequate maps or descriptions of political
558 subdivisions, wards or other divisions thereof, or of their
559 boundary lines, then the Secretary of State, at the request of the



560 Chair or Vice Chairman of the Standing Joint Legislative Committee
561 on Reapportionment shall, by order, correct such omissions,
562 overlaps, erroneous nomenclature or other defects in the
563 description of districts so as to accomplish the purposes and
564 objectives of this joint resolution.

565 (3) In promulgating such orders, the Secretary of State, in
566 addition to achieving equality in the population of districts as
567 permissible under law and ensuring that all areas of the state
568 are completely and accurately encompassed in such districts, shall
569 be guided by the following standards:

570 (a) In any instance in which there is a conflict
571 between the description of a district as provided in this joint
572 resolution and the map of the Senate districts developed by the
573 Standing Joint Legislative Committee on Reapportionment in
574 conjunction with the adopted redistricting plan, the map shall
575 control; however, in instances in which the map is inconclusive,
576 the criteria provided in paragraphs (b) through (f) of this
577 subsection shall control any dispute or issue regarding the
578 composition of any Senate district;

579 (b) Gaps in the description of a district shall be
580 completed in a manner that results in a total description of the
581 district that is consonant with the description of adjacent
582 districts and results in complete contiguity of districts;



583 (c) Areas of the state included within the descriptions
584 of more than one (1) district shall be allocated to the district
585 having the lowest population;

586 (d) Areas of the state not included within the
587 descriptions of any district shall be allocated to the adjacent
588 district having the lowest population;

589 (e) In the event that the area subject to corrected
590 description or allocation as provided in paragraphs (b), (c) and
591 (d) of this subsection is of such size or contains such population
592 that its inclusion as a unit in any district would result in
593 substantial disparity in the size, shape or population of the
594 district, then the Secretary of State may allocate portions of the
595 area to two (2) or more districts; and

596 (f) In any allocation of area or correction of
597 descriptions made pursuant to this joint resolution, the Secretary
598 of State shall, consistent with the foregoing standards, preserve
599 the contiguity and compactness of districts and avoid the
600 unnecessary division of political subdivisions.

601 (4) Copies of such orders shall be filed by the Secretary of
602 State in his office and in the offices of the affected
603 commissioners of election and registrars. The Secretary of State
604 may adopt reasonable rules regulating the procedure for
605 applications for orders under this joint resolution in the manner
606 of serving and filing a notice or copy of orders relating thereto.
607 Upon the filing of an order, the description of any affected



608 district shall be deemed to have been corrected in the manner
609 provided in such order to the full extent as if the correction had
610 been contained in the original description provided in this joint
611 resolution.

612 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Standing Joint Legislative
613 Committee on Reapportionment is directed to provide all
614 information necessary to assist the counties in identifying the
615 boundaries of the districts described in this joint resolution.

616 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the redistricting contained in
617 this joint resolution shall supersede any prior redistricting, and
618 any prior redistricting shall be null and void upon the date this
619 joint resolution is effectuated.

620 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chairman and Vice Chairman
621 of the Standing Joint Legislative Committee on Reapportionment
622 shall file copies of this plan with the Mississippi Department of
623 Archives and History, the Secretary of State, the Clerk of the
624 Mississippi House of Representatives, and the Secretary of the
625 Mississippi State Senate.

626 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That if any paragraph, sentence,
627 clause, phrase or any part of this joint resolution is declared to
628 be unconstitutional or void, or if for any reason is declared to
629 be invalid or of no effect, the remaining paragraphs, sentences,
630 clauses, phrases or parts thereof shall be in no manner affected
631 thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.



632 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the redistricting of House of
633 Representatives districts and Senate districts shall be deemed to
634 be separate from each other. The invalidity of the districts of
635 one (1) house shall not affect or require the redistricting of the
636 other house.

637 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Joint Legislative Committee
638 on Compilation, Revision and Publication of Legislation is hereby
639 directed to see to it that this resolution is placed in the
640 editor's notes that follow Section 5-1-3, Mississippi Code of
641 1972.

642 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Senate Rules
643 Committee, with the assistance of counsel, is hereby directed to
644 submit this resolution, upon its adoption by both houses of the
645 Legislature, to the United States District Court for the Southern
646 District of Mississippi, Northern Division, in the matter styled
647 Mississippi State Conf. of the NAACP v. State Bd. of Election
648 Comm'rs., No. 3:22-CV-734.

649 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in redrawing the new Senate
650 districts and affected surrounding districts, an effort was made
651 to affect the fewest districts possible, so as to minimize
652 confusion for the voters and the burden on local election
653 officials in administering elections.

654 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it is the intention of the
655 Legislature that all Senate elections conducted in districts



656 amended by this joint resolution, and held in 2025, be
657 administered in accordance with the following schedule:

658 April 25: Deadline for delivery of detailed maps and address
659 libraries to local election officials.

660 May 19: Qualifying begins.

661 May 30: Qualifying deadline.

662 June 6: Deadline for State Executive Committees to submit
663 names of qualified candidates.

664 June 21: The Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting
665 Act, PL 99-110, 100 Stat. 924, (UOCAVA) absentee voting begins for
666 special primary election.

667 August 5: Special Primary Election Day.

668 September 2: Special Primary Runoff Election Day.

669 September 20: UOCAVA absentee voting begins for special
670 general election.

671 November 4: Special General Election Day.

672 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall take
673 effect and be in force from and after its approval by the United
674 States District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi,
675 Northern Division, in the matter styled Mississippi State Conf. of
676 the NAACP v. State Bd. of Election Comm'rs., No. 3:22-CV-734."
