SENATE BILL NO. 2582

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SALES TAX DIVERSION STUDY COMMITTEE 2 TO EXAMINE, EVALUATE AND DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE 3 PROPER ALLOCATION OF SALES TAX REVENUE BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF 4 REVENUE AND MUNICIPALITIES; TO DETAIL THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 5 COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPOSITION OF THE COMMITTEE; TO 6 PROVIDE THAT THE COMMITTEE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND 7 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 1, 2025; TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO PROVIDE NECESSARY STAFF AND 8 9 LOGISTICAL SUPPORT TO THE COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 10 DISSOLUTION OF THE COMMITTEE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2026; AND FOR 11 RELATED PURPOSES.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

13 SECTION 1. (1) Sales Tax Diversion Study Committee

14 established. There is hereby created the Sales Tax Diversion

15 Study Committee to examine, evaluate and develop recommendations

16 regarding the proper allocation of sales tax revenue between the

17 Mississippi Department of Revenue and municipalities. The

- 19 (a) Conduct a comprehensive review of current sales tax
- 20 diversion practices and identify discrepancies;

(b) Assess the financial impact of misallocated sales
tax revenue on municipalities;

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23 Analyze technological solutions, including (C) 24 modernized software systems, to ensure accurate sales tax 25 distribution; 26 Evaluate the accountability and oversight (d) 27 mechanisms within the Department of Revenue; and 28 (e) Develop recommendations for legislative or 29 administrative reforms to be implemented in the next legislative 30 session. 31 (2)Composition of the committee. (a) The committee shall 32 be composed of the following eleven (11) members: 33 (i) The Commissioner of Revenue, or his/her 34 designee; 35 (ii) A member of the Mississippi State Senate 36 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; 37 (iii) A member of the Mississippi House of 38 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; 39 (iv) The Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, or his/her designee; 40 41 The Chairman of the House Ways and Means (V) 42 Committee, or his/her designee; 43 (vi) The Executive Director of the Mississippi 44 Municipal League, or his/her designee; 45 The State Director of the National (vii) 46 Federation of Independent Business, or his/her designee;

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47 (viii) The Executive Director of the Mississippi 48 Economic Council, or his/her designee; 49 (ix) A representative from a Mississippi municipality with a population over fifty thousand (50,000), 50 appointed by the Governor; 51 52 (X) A representative from a Mississippi 53 municipality with a population under fifty thousand (50,000), 54 appointed by the Governor; and 55 (xi) An appointee of the Governor. 56 Appointments to the committee shall be made within (b) 57 thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act. 58 (3) Committee organization and responsibilities. At (a) 59 its first meeting, the committee shall: 60 Elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson from (i) 61 among its members; and 62 (ii) Establish rules for transacting business and 63 keeping records. 64 The committee shall meet as necessary and report (b) 65 its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than December 1, 2025. 66 67 (C) A majority of committee members shall constitute a 68 quorum for conducting business. 69 (4)Support and cooperation. (a) The Department of Revenue 70 shall provide necessary staff and logistical support to the 71 committee.

(5) Dissolution of the committee. The committee shall be dissolved on or before January 1, 2026, unless extended by the Legislature.
