## SENATE BILL NO. 2588

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE LEGAL HOLIDAYS BY REMOVING CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL DAY AND DESIGNATING THE NINETEENTH DAY OF JUNE AS JUNETEENTH FREEDOM DAY; TO CLARIFY WHEN A LEGAL HOLIDAY WILL BE CELEBRATED IF THE HOLIDAY 5 FALLS ON A SATURDAY OR SUNDAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 3-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 3-3-7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) 10 of this section, the following are declared to be legal holidays, 11 viz: 12 (a) The first day of January (New Year's Day); 13 (b) The third Monday of January (Robert E. Lee's birthday and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday); 14 15 (c) The third Monday of February (Washington's 16 birthday); \* \* \* 17 (d) The last Monday of May (National Memorial Day and 18

- 48 (4) May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in

- 50 who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by
- 51 Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of
- 52 Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's
- 53 187-day journey from the Tombigbee River basin on our state's
- 54 eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the
- 55 Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall be a day of
- 56 commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and
- 57 European exploration and shall not be recognized as a legal
- 58 holiday.
- 59 (5) Armistice Day (Veterans' Day) shall be observed by
- 60 appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of
- 61 Mississippi. The superintendent of schools of each public school
- 62 district is authorized to provide for the appearance of uniformed
- 63 military personnel, uniformed veterans or the families of fallen
- 64 military personnel/veterans at such public school exercises in
- 65 honor of Armistice (Veterans') Day. The superintendent of schools
- 66 is also authorized to permit the school band and its director(s)
- 67 at any public school in the district to perform at Armistice
- 68 (Veterans') Day exercises in the school district upon the request
- 69 of public officials or veterans associations without loss of any

- 70 program credit by participating students and without loss of leave
- 71 by participating school personnel.
- 72 (6) The month of March is declared to be "Mississippi
- 73 Musicians Month" to recognize and celebrate the state's rich
- 74 musical heritage and to encourage the world to join Mississippi in
- 75 honoring our musicians and their contributions.
- 76 (7) In recognition of the service, courage and sacrifice of
- 77 the valiant service members of the Tuskegee Airmen who served
- 78 during World War II, the fourth Thursday of March is designated as
- 79 Tuskegee Airmen Day in Mississippi. This should be a day of
- 80 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
- 81 holiday.
- 82 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 83 and after its passage.
